Clinton Sunrise Rotary - Dictionaries Spark Curiosity of CPS Students; by Lu Ann Aversa: If you think today's youth are only interested in the latest video game or technological advance, think again. Old-fashioned paper dictionaries have captured the interest of Clinton Public School's 3rd graders. The dictionaries were a gift from the Clinton Sunrise Rotary Club as part of Rotary's Dictionary Project. Rotarians Lynn Arnold, Lu Ann Aversa, Pat Caroselli, Megan Jones-Holt, Deb Shenberger, and Andrew West, honorary member Carol Crawford-Jones and Horizons e-club member Jessica Viotto distributed the books at a school assembly on March 1st.

The goal of this program, which started in Savannah, GA in 1992, is to assist all students in becoming good writers, active readers, creative thinkers, and resourceful learners by providing them with their own personal dictionary. The dictionaries are a gift to each student to use at school and at home for years to come. Educators see third grade as the dividing line between learning to read and reading to learn. Nationwide, 18,255,644 children have received a dictionary to date; 2,397,306 dictionaries were given to students in 2012.

The dictionaries were distributed after the Rotarians participated in "Read Across America" day at the school by reading Dr. Seuss's *The Lorax* to the third graders. The students listened intently to this story of environmental awareness. Although written for children, the message of what can happen if we don't take care of our environment resonated for the adult readers as well. Many of the children were well aware of the story and had clear opinions on protecting our trees and habitats.

One of the CPS students' favorite discoveries in their dictionaries was on the last page of the book – the longest word in the English language. There were giggles all around as Rotarian Megan Jones-Holt challenged the children to try to pronounce it. I'm not going to tell you what that word is though. Go look it up in your dictionary!

Award Presented to D.J. Wright by Our District Governor Elect, Tulsi R. Maharjan: DGE Tulsi was in attendance at last Wednesday's Rotary meeting (2/13) to present an Award to our own D.J. Wright for going above and beyond to help another person. Tulsi is the leader of the "Friends of Nepal-New Jersey" group. A gentleman from Nepal came here to work in NJ to make some money for his family back in Nepal. While here, he was hit by a truck while trying to cross Easton Avenue in New Brunswick in the dark one night after work. Tulsi's "Friends of Nepal-NJ" group handled all immigration paperwork, then raised enough money to fly his wife over ASAP so that she could see him prior just prior to him being disconnected from life support and pass away. Since the airfare cost thousands of dollars, there was no money to bury him. So Tulsi called D.J. and asked him what could be done. D.J. immediately responded by asking what religion the person was and if they had any funeral customs. Since the man was Buddhist, D.J. arranged for a very nice service at the local crematory in Ewing Township and conducted the entire Funeral at no cost. D.J. felt this was the right thing to do; by having the man's body respected just as it would have been in the man's homeland of Nepal. Tulsi presented D.J. with the award out of true appreciation for what D.J. did for the man and his family. Thanks, D.J. for going above and beyond!!!! Congratulations on an award well deserved!!!

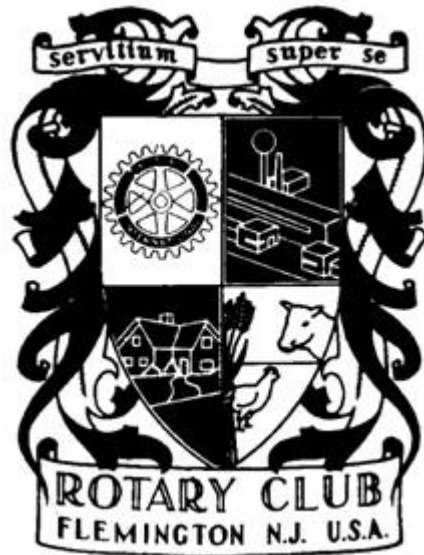
