Clinton Sunrise Rotary Club - Fishing Derby Set at DeMott Pond (Sat, 4/27): The annual Pete Pender Memorial Fishing Derby will be held on Saturday, 4/27, rain or shine. DeMott Pond will be stocked with trout for this free family event, and bait, bobbers and hooks will be supplied; just bring your own pole. The Derby has been a long standing tradition in Clinton and has always been a positive experience for the youth of our community. It truly is an example of small town America at its best. The event is sponsored by the Clinton Sunrise Rotary Club. Clinton Sunrise Rotary Club - Sponsors Needed For Clinton Traditions (Sun, 7/14): The Clinton Sunrise Rotary is pleased to announce the continuance of 2 Clinton traditions: the 24th annual Rubber Ducky Race and the 33rd annual Sprintin Clinton, a 5K race and 1 mile fun run/walk. Both events are scheduled for Sunday, July 14th.

“Our Rubber Ducky event draws people of all ages, stated Lynn Arnold, Clinton Sunrise Rotary Rubber Ducky Race Director. “Downtown Clinton is full of duck sponsors and spectators cheering the ducks on in their race to the finish line!” The race is run in the south branch of the Raritan River beginning near the Hunterdon Art Museum, over the falls, under the famed Clinton bridge and downstream a few hundred yards. The race start is at 2pm.

Individuals can sponsor a duck for \$10 and have the opportunity to win one of several great prizes. First prize is a 4 day, 3 night Walt Disney World Package for two (includes air for 2, hotel, & Park Passes) or a trip of equivalent value. Proceeds from this event benefit the American Cancer Society and the Cancer Support Community CNJ.

In the evening, the Sprintin Clinton again draws participants and spectators of all ages. The event begins with a one mile fun run and culminates with the traditional 5k race. “Since this event has taken place for 33 years, we have many local area residents who run year after year in addition to runners from as far away as Boulder, CO,” stated Brian Fischer, Sprintin Clinton Race Director. “These are fun events that bring the community together.” Race pre-entry fees are \$12 for the Fun Run and \$25 for the 5K.

Commercial sponsorships for these events are also available. There are various sponsorship levels ranging from \$100 for a Water Sponsor to \$2,500 for a 5K or Family Fun Run Sponsor. Sponsors can receive double media exposure as, depending on the sponsorship level, they may be highlighted at both events.

“The Clinton Sunrise Rotary has been a viable part of the North Hunterdon community for many years,”

stated Deb Shenberger, Clinton Sunrise Rotary President. “Our members work together to address both the needs of our local community and in the international arena. Locally, we have provided financial support to various community agencies such as the Open Cupboard Food Pantry and the Clinton Fire & Rescue Squads. In addition, we provide scholarships for local high school students; collaborate with Hunterdon County Polytech to bring the “Bridging the Gap” program, an educational business skills workshop, to the students; conduct annual flu shot clinics and an annual blood drive; contribute to the safety of our children and community by purchasing & donating a “Speed Caution” sign for the town of Clinton; and assisting local residents in need with emergency funding. Internationally, we sponsor “Polio Plus” - a Rotary program whose aim is to eradicate polio worldwide; and we support the “Homes of Hope” project in Ecuador building low-cost housing for single mothers and their families.”

Funds raised from commercial sponsorships and race entries help to support these projects and this year will also be used to purchase outdoor exercise equipment for a Fit Trail that Clinton Sunrise Rotary plans to donate to the town of Clinton. Installation is planned for Spring 2014.

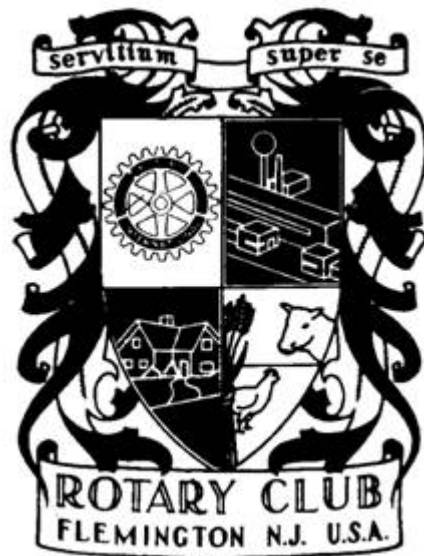
