<u>Cost to Attend</u>: Weekly paying members will pay \$14 for their meal. Members who pay quarterly and all spouses attend free of charge.

Rotary International Foundation Annual Contributions - \$100 Every Rotarian, Every Year: As you know, all members are encouraged to "Donate \$100 Every Year" to the Rotary International (RI) Foundation. RI initially invests the money for a period of 3-years. After 3-years, RI uses the interest earned to run RI. Then 50% of the original contribution comes back to our Rotary District for our use in Grants, Ambassadorial Scholarships, and other District programs. The remaining 50% of the original contribution goes towards RI's international humanitarian efforts, including Polio Plus and Clean Water. Once a member has donated a total of \$1000, accrued over time, they are acknowledged with a Paul Harris Recognition. A Rotarian is considered a "sustaining member" if they consistently make a donation on a yearly basis. The separate money collected from the Polio Bee Hives and Polio Pigs supports RI's Polio Plus program to help eliminate Polio from the world. <u>Clinton Sunrise Rotary Press Release - Rubber Ducks Battle Cancer in Clinton, NJ (Sun, 7/14)</u>: At 2pm on Sunday, July 14th this year, hundreds of yellow rubber ducks will be fighting cancer in Clinton NJ. In this 24 year tradition, the Clinton Sunrise Rotary Club will release the ducks into the scenic Raritan River where they will race to raise funds for the American Cancer Society and The Cancer Support Community CNJ.

"This year in NJ approximately 49,000 people will be diagnosed with cancer. Every dollar we raise takes us a step closer to a cure and to improve the quality of life for cancer survivors," says Lynn Arnold, Rubber Ducky Race Director and Club Community Chair. Our donations to these 2 organizations will be used to support Patient Services, Cancer Education, Advocacy, Cancer Research and Prevention."

Although the topic is serious, it's meant to be a lot of fun. "We have a great turnout for the day," says Lynn. "It's a fun time for the whole family. It's so scenic...there are shops, places to eat, museums. Kids & adults alike have a great time watching the ducks go over the waterfall and under the historic Main Street Bridge."

There are prizes too! The sponsor of the first duck to cross the finish line will win a 4 day 3 night Walt Disney World package including airfare for 2, plus hotel and Park Passes, or a trip of equivalent value. The second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth and even the last place duck have prizes as well.

Clinton Sunrise Rotary Press Release - 33rd Annual Sprintin Clinton 5K Race (Sun, 7/14): The Clinton Sunrise Rotary is pleased to announce the continuance of a Clinton tradition with their 33rd annual Sprintin Clinton, a 5K race and 1 mile fun run/walk scheduled for Sunday, July 14th. The race begins at 6:30pm and typically attracts several hundred runners and countless spectators. Entry fees are \$25 for the 5K and \$12 for the Fun Run/Walk until 7/4. After that date, fees go up to \$30 & \$15 respectively. Entry forms, in addition to sponsorship opportunities, are also available on the website.

There are various sponsorship levels available from \$100 for a Water Sponsor to \$2,500 for a Family Fun Run or 5K sponsor. Sponsors can receive double media exposure as, depending on the sponsorship level, they may be highlighted at two events: Sprintin Clinton and the Great Hunterdon Rubber Ducky race, which takes place earlier the same day.

Many volunteers are also needed for the event's success. People are needed from the hours of 4:30pm-7:30pm for various areas: set-up, registration, parking marshals, water station, finish line & clean-up.

Not up to taking part physically? You can still join in the fun. Grab your lawn chair and come on out to cheer the participants on. It's a fantastic event – right in your own backyard!

"The Clinton Sunrise Rotary has been a viable part of the North Hunterdon community for many years," stated Dave Gansfuss, Race Co-Director. "Our members work together to address both the needs of our local community and in the international arena. Locally, we have provided financial support to various community agencies such as the Open Cupboard Food Pantry and the Clinton Fire & Rescue Squads. In addition, we provide scholarships for local high school students; collaborate with Hunterdon County Polytech to bring the "Bridging the Gap" program, an educational business skills workshop, to the students; conduct annual flu shot clinics and an annual blood drive; contribute to the safety of our children and community by purchasing & donating a "Speed Caution" sign for the town of Clinton; and assisting local residents in need with emergency funding. Internationally, we sponsor "Polio Plus" - a Rotary program whose aim is to eradicate polio worldwide; and we support the "Homes of Hope" project in Ecuador building low-cost housing for single mothers and their families."

Funds raised from sponsorships and race entries help to support these projects and this year some of the funds will be earmarked for a Fit Trail in Clinton – construction is slated for spring 2014. 
