Rotary International Foundation Annual Contributions - \$100 Every Rotarian, Every Year

As you know, all members are encouraged to "Donate \$100 Every Year" to the Rotary International (RI) Foundation. RI initially invests the money for a period of 3-years. After 3-years, RI uses the interest earned to run RI. Then 50% of the original contribution comes back to our Rotary District for our use in Grants, Ambassadorial Scholarships, and other District programs. The remaining 50% of the original contribution goes towards RI's international humanitarian efforts, including Polio Plus and Clean Water. Once a member has donated a total of \$1000, accrued over time, they are acknowledged with a Paul Harris Recognition. A Rotarian is considered a "sustaining member" if they consistently make a donation on a yearly basis. The separate money collected from the Polio Bee Hives and Polio Pigs supports RI's Polio Plus program to help eliminate Polio


