
RIDE FOR ROTARY AN "AWESOME TIME"

"Everyone had an absolutely awesome day. This is exactly what we hoped to accomplish with Ride for Rotary!!!" enthused event chairman Bob Chittenden at last week's Rotary meeting, recapping the 2nd annual motorcycle poker run, picnic and clambake that was held on September 17 at Clinton Elks Lodge.

"We had a great turnout Saturday!!!! 280 people attended: 136 motorcyclists and 144 picnic participants, including 12 children," Chittenden reported. "Everyone - from the motorcyclists to the children, Rotarians to the picnickers - had a fantastic time! And I understand that at least 42 Rotarians helped out.'

"Thanks to all of the generous sponsors and participants, our profit was over \$11,000.'

"I'm very happy we had some sun this year, since last year we were visited by Hurricane Ivan on the day of our ride!" said Chittenden. "But this is a weatherdependent event. In the future, we could have another rainy day. However, our sponsors help offset the cost of the event, so we might still have small profits in rainy years. Rain dates are difficult. ALL club members would have to set aside both dates for the event and we'd have to book



- and pay for - both dates at the facility we use. It's more complicated and costly, and is still no guarantee, weatherwise.

tertaining the crowd throughout the day. Most of the food was donated by Stewart's Drive-In of Ringoes,




