Our president reminded the club that Craig Proctor was to be honored by the Boy Scouts that night at Hunterdon Hills Playhouse.

Jeff Mattison supplied two tickets to the dinner, courtesy of Yardville National Bank, to be auctioned off by Harrie Copeland with proceeds to go to the club. Wayne Randolph was the lowest and highest bidder.

Later, Sergeant-at-Arms Jeff Mattison quizzed the club on the names of other of our members who have been honored by the Boy Scouts. They are George Muller, Kirby Fowler, Richard Stothoff, Catherine Langley, Bob Wise, Fred Ferrari and Harrie Copeland.

DONATIONS TO THE FOOD PANTRY

John Zullo announced that over the past three years our members have donated to the Flemington Area Food Pantry about \$2,000 and 525 cans of food.

John also called a meeting of the Food Pantry Committee – consisting of himself, Larry Sivilli, Ken Skowronek and (*How* do you say it, John?!) Cowles Herr. They will be giving the club new ideas for helping the Food Pantry.

FLEMINGTON AREA FOOD PANTRY

Coincidentally, our program was about the Food Pantry! Its director Madelyn Alessandrini provided some provocative statistics: about 900 families – totaling about 2,000 people including 90 senior citizens, all of whom are low income – get food from the pantry. Most of these are working families. Annually, every family is required to prove their continued need.

Each year, the Food Pantry receives about \$240,000 worth of food donated by individuals and local grocery stores. But what isn't received in donations, must be bought. About \$96,000 is spent buying food: \$2,000-3,000 per month from NORWESCAP at a rate of 18¢ per pound, and the rest from Stop & Shop and ShopRite.

The Food Pantry has several needs that we could help with: Volunteers with trucks or vans are needed to pick food at grocery stores; this is a heavy lifting job. Other volunteers are needed to help check-out food that the clients select. And the biggie – next year the Food Pantry will lose its current location. It needs a new location that is handicapped-accessible, with at least 5,000 sq. ft. of space, a loading dock, and sufficient parking.

Madelyn invited all of us to stop by anytime. They are open Mondays–Thursdays 9–11:30 am and two Saturdays per month. Gwen Williams suggested that each Rotarian consider donating a few hours.
