PEDALS FOR PROGRESS

While the original goal of Pedals for Progress founder David Schweidenbach was to ship 12 bicycles to a village in Ecuador he served while in the Peace Corps, to date the program has shipped over 95,000 and 600 sewing machines to 28 countries on five continents. Bicycles and sewing machines become a "significant means of economic development."

The program is nearly 70 percent self sufficient, making up the rest with 30 percent donations. For this year, due to tsunami and hurricane relief, the program is running at a loss and requests contributions.

FLEMINGTON ROCKS

HUNTERDON COUNTY MEDICATION ACCESS PARTNERSHIP — FOR THOSE WHO "FALL THROUGH THE CRACKS"

Spokespeople Mark Peters and Karen Kallens introduced the club to this program that helps Hunterdon County residents who need medication but cannot afford it.

Although we live in the "wealth belt," Hunterdon has 3,373 people at or below the poverty level, many of whom, however, do not meet existing criteria for state or federal assistance. The partnership connects concerned individuals, congregations, businesses, healthcare services and governmental organizations to increase awareness of this problem and increase access to affordable prescription medications.

The program assisted over 248 individuals in the community with either free medicine, funding for prescription medicine or referrals to an appropriate discount prescription medicine program.

They also distributed a fact sheet of the best discount programs to healthcare providers throughout the county and provided over 1,000 volunteer hours to help the community become better informed about discount and free government, charity and pharmaceutical company programs.

Founder Mark Peters, who is a pharmacist, was motivated to start the program when he discovered years after the fact that a generous pharmacist had not billed his family for \$3,000 of medication because he knew they were in need.

RN Karen Kallens, who administers the program, related some stories about patients who were able to be helped since discount and free medication is available — you just have to be able to navigate the application process, which is where Karen is of help.

In 2005, the program provided \$263,000 of free medicine to Hunterdon County residents who could not afford their prescriptions.


ROTARY ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS
