At the May 31 meeting, club members were treated to Hunterdon Central students who are members of the International Thespian Society, an elite group of students who are exceptionally active in high school drama projects.

They gave tremendous performances, despite the microphone's not working *again!*

Senior Renee Stairs sang "I Don't Know How to Love Him," from Andrew Lloyd Weber's musical *Jesus Christ, Superstar*. A small boom box in a crowded room of septuagenarians is not exactly the best setting for a lead-off performance but Renee performed like a trouper, as she has in many Hunterdon Central performances. A voice of this quality shows obviously the results of lots of instruction and practice, but there's some of it "you're just born with."

and his fast hands and fast hat, performed both the Abbott and Costello roles.

In addition, their blend of voices is extraordinary when you consider what a diverse set of voices they have. This was highlighted by the democratic distribution of solos, where no one was a "star," but everyone was a star.

They most definitely "handed us the world on a silver platter." "Some people want diamond rings" but who needs them with this kind of performance to savor?

Central is going to miss these talented seniors, but the juniors who performed today prove that the school has many more talented students just waiting in the wings.
