• In 2007, HMC got the highest possible rankings from a national rating service in general surgery and critical care. In 2006, HMC was highest in stroke, gastrointestinal services and orthopedic surgery.

It just may be that HMC is becoming one of those destinations that far-flung patients seek for outstanding healthcare.
