Rotarians bring solar system to Anchorage

In Anchorage, Alaska, you don't need a telescope to look at the planets -- you can walk to them.

The local Rotary club and amateur astronomer Eli Menaker created a scale-model planet walk that starts downtown at a 3-ton model of the sun. Trekkers encounter each of the planets along a 10-mile route.

Every step equals 186,000 miles, and heading to Jupiter from Earth is a little more than a half-hour stroll.

Menaker introduced the idea of a temporary display to city officials in 2003 while a student at Service High School in Anchorage. Later, Anchorage Rotarians approached him about making the display permanent, as

part of the club's centennial project.

The club raised more than \$620,000 to carry out the plan.

A local artist used over 2,400 ceramic tiles to craft a 12-foot-by-6-foot hemispherical model of the sun and sculpted sunspots to scale.

Menaker wrote text describing the planets and consulted with an artist and a contractor to configure the planet kiosks. Others created a digital display for the sun station at the start of the walk.

Rotarians reached out to the city's school district and Imaginarium science center to incorporate the project into school curriculums. They also pushed the fitness aspect of the walk through events like the Run/Walk Winter Solstice Challenge.

Rotarians offer support in wake of Mumbai violence

More than 300 Mumbai Rotarians joined city residents on Dec. 3 in a peace march to mourn the dead and protest the violence that began in the city on Nov. 26. In a show of unity and peace, they carried Rotary flags and banners.

Rotarians and their families stood in long lines to donate blood. They also contacted hospitals offering support and comfort to victims.

The Rotary Club of Bombay was left without a home, due to fire damage at the Taj Mahal hotel where the club had met since 1929.
