Pedals for Progress Bicycle, Sewing Machine & Sports Equipment Collection (Sat, June 5): Joe Ziegler has asked us to mark our calendars for Saturday, June 5 to help collect <u>Used Bicycles</u> (adult and child), <u>Used Sewing Machines</u> (in working condition) and <u>Sports Equipment</u> (soccer balls, baseball gloves, etc. that can fit in the shipping containers between the bikes). The collection will take place at the **Flemington** Presbyterian Church located at 10 East Main Street in Flemington, NJ from **9am to 12noon**.

Pedals for Progress, also known as P4P, collects over 11,000 bicycles annually and transfers this material wealth to those more needy. To date, more than 117,000 bicycles have been shipped to developing countries in Latin America, Africa, and the Pacific Islands. In these countries, the bikes are reconditioned by partner agencies and distributed at low cost to poor working adults. These bikes provide them with reliable transportation for commuting to work, transporting produce to market, or accessing health care and other services. Steady employment for these adults is vital to the development and success for these economies.


