We had nearly 150 dogs and 1 goat participate in the event. There were also hundreds of participants, vendors, sponsors, kids and animals rocking to the music provided by "Sun Dog" at no cost to us from 11:30am to 2:00pm. It is estimated that we sold approximately 250 hot dogs as well as countless pretzels, sodas and bottled water. There was also coffee and donuts available early in the morning. People are definitely more apt to purchase food and drink on a hot day. President Jim and the Committee did an excellent job with the event. Terry Ownes & Wayne Randolph did an excellent job planning the food concession. Dan Alte did a great job working the crowd and selling pretzels. [Pedals for Progress Bicycle, Sewing Machine & Sports Equipment Collection \(Sat, June 5\)](#): The annual Pedals for Progress (P4P) collection was held this past **Saturday, June 5**. The collection took place at the Flemington Presbyterian Church located at 10 East Main Street in Flemington, NJ from 9am to 12noon.

Joe Ziegler reported that Saturday's collection garnered **61 bicycles and \$825 in cash**. A cash donation of \$10 per bicycle is requested to help offset the shipping cost. The \$825 collected yielded an average \$13.52 per bike received. Joe noted that Pedals for Progress bike collections are down 40% below normal this Spring. This is not just here in Flemington, but all over due to the economy. It was noted that some people would rather throw a bike in the garbage to avoid the \$10 donation requested along with a bike.

Saturday's bicycles will be shipped to **Ghana**. Joe will provide more details at Wednesday's meeting.

We even had some surprise help. Floyd Deardorff, who has been involved with P4P from the beginning and now lives in Nazareth, PA, attended out of habit to lend a hand. Thanks Floyd! It was great to see you! Tom Thatcher also brought his daughter to the collection, who was a great help. Thanks Tom!

To date, more than **125,000 bicycles** have been shipped to over 14 Worldwide Destinations. This includes developing countries in Latin America, Africa, Ghana and the Pacific Islands. In these countries, the bikes are reconditioned by partner agencies and distributed at low cost to poor working adults. These bikes provide them with reliable transportation for commuting to work, transporting produce to market, or accessing health care and other services. Steady employment for these adults is vital to the development and success for these economies. A sewing machine alone can create a job for someone.

We even had a surprise helper, attending from Nazareth, PA. **Floyd Deardorff**, who has been involved with P4P from the beginning, attended out of habit to lend a hand. Thanks Floyd! It was great to see you! Tom Thatcher also brought his daughter to the collection, who was a great help.

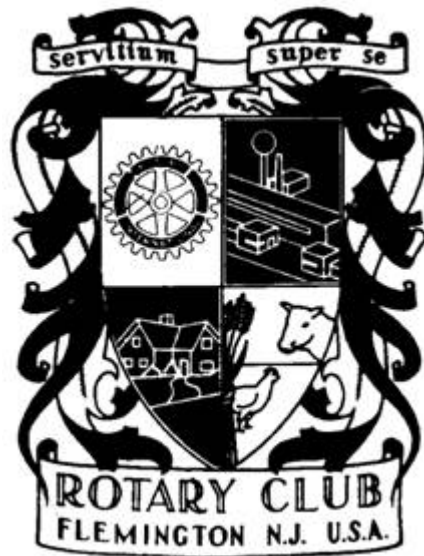
