

2010 Ride for Rotary - Preliminary Summary Report

Dear Fellow Rotarians,

As you know, our 2010 Ride for Rotary event was held this past Saturday, September 18, 2010!!! We had excellent weather, which helped us attract approximately 200 day-of registrants, in addition to the 130 that were pre-registered. Although a few sponsors did not attend, we have estimated an attendance of **300 to 330 people**. This is up from 230 last year, which had date conflicts with other events that were scheduled on our same date for the 2009 event.

This year there was a significant effort to increase event & club publicity. Two (2) color event banners were designed by Sheila Fernekes and printed by the Polytech. They were displayed on the corner of Church & Main Street (thanks to Ken Skowronek) and at the corner of Walter E Foran & Route 31 at Shammy Shine (thanks to Jim Davidson). Burgers Motorcycles continues to pay the \$100 permit from Readington Twp to display two (2) banners on their store on Route 202; and they also handle updating & storing those banners. We printed (500) color flyers that were personally paid for by Wayne Randolph and Terry Ownes. We previously submitted Press Releases to the HC Democrat, Courier News and Star Ledger. Thanks to D.J. Wright, this was expanded to (15) additional newspapers. Sheila Fernekes was instrumental in generating the new color layouts, which included a digital image that was able to be emailed to various people without cost. The new FRBA membership allows us to reach a significant number of local Flemington Area businesses in their monthly newsletter. We also printed ten (10) sandwich board signs that we previously didn't do. We have continued to mail a pre-registration form and event info to all prior event attendees, which we do every year. All in all, we spent a little more on publicity, but people really seemed to have noticed it and it proved to be well worth it.

We had some last minute unexpected expenses. Stewarts Drive-In of Ringoes was originally thought to be donating the 4000 little neck clams. At last minute, they were not able to do this. The H.C. Polytech used their buying power to help us buy these for \$800, which is a good price. We also needed to purchase the corn this year at the last minute.

The Clinton Elks, which is a fantastic location for the event, increased their costs this year from \$550 to \$825. Included in this cost is a \$200 handicap accessible port-a-john, since the Elks toilets are not ADA accessible. We were also required to pay for a Franklin Twp Police Officer from noon to 3pm for \$75 per hour (\$225), as we are required every year.

We still have approximately eight (8) outstanding sponsors that we are waiting to collect payment from, which totals \$1700. We fully expect to collect this. This is typical from year to year.

All in all, with the state of the economy, raffle ticket sales and increased costs, I am *estimating* our final profit to be approximately \$14,000 (plus or minus)!!! While we are still waiting to receive a few checks and invoices, this breaks down as follows:

Day-Of Registration (including the sales of shirts and ride pins) brought in \$5086 in sales.

Sponsors: We had \$9750 in Cash Sponsorships. We are currently waiting to receive approximately \$1700.

Raffle Sales: We were once again trying to sell (2000) \$10 raffle tickets this year for a total \$20,000. We sold \$8400 in tickets, which is about \$2250 more than last year. This yielded a \$4200 profit solely from the raffle. The winners are:

- 1. 1st Prize of \$2900 (35% of sales)...... **Sean McKiernan**

Live Auction: Bob Wise very generously donated four (4) tickets to the Monday, 9/20/2010 Yankee's game. The tickets each had a face value of \$40 for a total value of \$160. We managed to sell the tickets for \$280; however, Bill Melchione, the highest bidder, paid \$300.

Ride for Rotary Committee: A very special thanks to the Committee for their *many* hours of help and support!!! They are:
