<u>Hunterdon Central's Lisa Brady named School Superintendent of Year</u>: By Hunterdon County Democrat (Thanks to John Hyman for sharing!)

The Hunterdon County Association of School Administrators has enthusiastically and unanimously selected Dr. Lisa Brady of Hunterdon Central Regional High School as the Hunterdon County Superintendent of the Year.

Brady first came to Hunterdon in 1997 as an assistant principal, then became principal in 2000 at Hunterdon Central. She became superintendent of the South Hunterdon High School in 2004, then returned to Hunterdon Central as superintendent in 2007, where she just completed her fourth year in that position.

Brady is known state-wide, as well as nationally. Her leadership, commitment to and persistence in the area of random drug testing took her to Washington D.C. where she testified and ultimately helped to win the Supreme Court case legalizing random drug testing at the high school level. As a result, several schools in the state have successfully implemented such programs, potentially saving many lives.

Dr. Charles Shaddow, president of the Hunterdon County Association of School Administrators, said, "Though Lisa is moving on to be the superintendent of the Dobb's Ferry School District in New York, she has left her mark on education in Hunterdon County and she will be missed. She is most deserving of this award."

Brady's name has been submitted to the New Jersey Association of School Administrators for consideration as one of the three Regional Superintendents of the Year.

8th Annual RIDE FOR ROTARY – Motorcycle Poker Run, Picnic & Clam Bake (Sat, 9/17): The 8th annual family-oriented motorcycle "Poker Run" will be held on Saturday, September 17, 2011, followed by a community picnic and clam bake! The start and end location will be the Clinton Elks Lodge, Sidney Road (County Route 617), Pittstown, NJ. Riders check in at the Clinton Elks Lodge between 9 and 11am before leaving on the motorcycle poker run through approximately 65 miles of scenic Hunterdon County and surrounding areas. Riders will drive their motorcycles along a pre-determined route and stop to select a playing card from each of five locations. After selecting the 5th card, each rider will have a "poker hand". The first prize for best poker hand is \$250, second prize is \$100 and third prize is \$50. The ride ends with a community picnic and clam bake at the Clinton Elks Lodge. Everyone -- non-riders, families, friends, kids, adults -- is invited to the picnic and clam bake which runs from noon to 3pm. Food, beverages, prizes, 50/50 cash raffle (tickets are \$10 each), face painting for kids, vendors and music by Krazy Kat himself! <u>Clinton Sunrise Rotary Club's 22nd Annual Rubber Duck Race (Sun, 7/10)</u>: Rubber Duck Race has raised over \$180,000 for American Cancer Society. At 2pm on July 10th this year, hundreds of yellow rubber ducks will be fighting cancer in Clinton NJ. In this 22 year tradition, The Clinton Sunrise Rotary Club will release the ducks into the scenic Raritan River where they will race to raise funds for the American Cancer Society and The Wellness Community of Central NJ.

"This year in NJ approximately 44,000 people will be diagnosed with cancer. Every dollar we raise takes us a step closer to a cure and to improve the quality of life for cancer survivors," says Lynn Arnold, Rubber Ducky Race Director and Club President. Our donations to these 2 organizations will be used to support Patient Services, Cancer Education, Advocacy, Cancer Research and Prevention."

Although the topic is serious, it's meant to be a lot of fun. "We have a great turnout for the day," says Lynn. "It's a fun time for the whole family. It's so scenic...there are shops, places to eat, museums. Kids have a great time watching the ducks go over the waterfall and under the historic Main Street Bridge."

There are prizes too! The sponsor of the first duck to cross the finish line will win a 4 day 3 night Walt Disney World package including airfare for 2, plus hotel and Park Passes. The second, third, fourth, fifth and even the last place duck have prizes as well.

<u>Clinton Sunrise Rotary - 32nd Annual Sprintin Clinton 5K Race (Sun, 7/10)</u>: The Clinton Sunrise Rotary is pleased to announce the continuance of a Clinton tradition with their 32nd annual Sprintin Clinton, a 5K race and 1 mile fun run/walk scheduled for Sunday, July 10th. The race begins at 6:30pm and typically attracts over 400 runners and countless spectators. Entry fees are \$22 for the 5K and \$12 for the Fun Run/Walk until 7/5. After that date, fees go up to \$30 & \$15 respectively. Entry forms, in addition to sponsorship opportunities, are also available on the website.

There are various sponsorship levels available from \$100 for a Water Sponsor to \$2,500 for a presenting sponsor. Sponsors can receive double media exposure as, depending on the sponsorship level, they may be highlighted at two events: Sprintin Clinton and the Great Hunterdon Rubber Ducky race, which takes place earlier the same day.

Many volunteers are also needed for the event's success. People are needed from the hours of 4:30pm-7:30pm for various areas: set-up, registration, parking marshals, water station, finish line & clean-up.

Not up to taking part physically? You can still join in the fun. Grab your lawn chair and come on out to cheer the participants on. It's a fantastic event – right in your own backyard!

"The Clinton Sunrise Rotary has been a viable part of the North Hunterdon community for many years," stated Brian Fischer, Race Director. "Our members work together to address both the needs of our local community and in the international arena. Locally, we have provided financial support to various community agencies such as the Open Cupboard Food Pantry and the Clinton Fire & Rescue Squads. In addition, we provide scholarships for local high school students; collaborate with Hunterdon County Polytech to bring the "Bridging the Gap" program, an educational business skills workshop, to the students; conduct an annual flu shot clinic and an annual blood drive; contribute to the safety of our children and community by purchasing & donating a "Speed Caution" sign for the town of Clinton; and assisting local residents in need with emergency funding. Internationally, we sponsor "Polio Plus" - a Rotary program whose aim is to eradicate polio worldwide; and we support the "Homes of Hope" project in Ecuador building low-cost housing for single mothers and their families."


