8<sup>th</sup> Annual RIDE FOR ROTARY – Motorcycle Poker Run, Picnic & Clam Bake (Sat, 9/17): The 8<sup>th</sup> annual family-oriented motorcycle "Poker Run" will be held on Saturday, September 17, 2011, followed by a community picnic and clam bake! The start and end location will be the Clinton Elks Lodge, Sidney Road (County Route 617), Pittstown, NJ. Riders check in at the Clinton Elks Lodge between 9 and 11am before leaving on the motorcycle poker run through approximately 65 miles of scenic Hunterdon County and surrounding areas. Riders will drive their motorcycles along a pre-determined route and stop to select a playing card from each of five locations. After selecting the 5<sup>th</sup> card, each rider will have a "poker hand". The first prize for best poker hand is \$250, second prize is \$100 and third prize is \$50. The ride ends with a community picnic and clam bake at the Clinton Elks Lodge. Everyone -- non-riders, families, friends, kids, adults -- is invited to the picnic and clam bake which runs from noon to 3pm. <u>Flemington Poker Run and Clam Bake Sept. 17</u> (online article Published by the Hunterdon County Democrat on Sun, 8/14 via www.NJ.com) (Click Here for the Online Article):

Hundreds of motorcyclists are expected at the eighth Annual Ride for Rotary — Motorcycle Poker Run, Picnic & Clam Bake, to be hosted by the Rotary Club of Flemington on Saturday, Sept. 17.

The approx 65-mile motorcycle "poker run" includes prizes for riders and family members, plus a festive clam bake and picnic. Riders and picnickers should pre-register by Sept. 1 to get a free event shirt and be guaranteed clams. Others can register directly at the event.

For riders, the starting and ending location is the Clinton Elks Lodge, 211 Sidney Road, Pittstown. Breakfast will be provided during check-in between 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. The ride proceeds approx 65 miles through scenic Hunterdon County and surrounding areas. Prizes include \$250 for the best poker hand, \$100 for 2nd best and \$50 for the 3rd best hand.

All proceeds from the event will benefit Flemington Rotary's many charitable projects, which are devoted to youth, senior citizens and the disabled. This includes annual scholarships for local high school seniors and community service projects.

Rider registration is \$25 including breakfast and lunch. Those who pre-register by Sept 1 also receive a commemorative T-shirt and are guaranteed clams. For those who register on event day, shirts will be sold for \$15 each & clams will be available while supplies last.

Families, friends and non-riders are all invited to the picnic that follows the ride, from noon to 3 p.m. at the Clinton Elks Lodge. Enjoy food, beverages, prizes, a cash raffle, a tattoo contest, face painting and other activities for the kids, vendors and music by DJ extraordinaire "Krazy Kat" himself. Picnic tickets are \$25 for adults and \$5 for kids ages five to 11. Only those who pre-register are guaranteed clams and T-shirts.

A 50/50 cash raffle will be held during the event. Tickets are \$10 each, with a limit of 2,000 tickets. First prize is 35% of tickets sales (potential \$7,000); second prize, 10% (potential \$2,000); and third prize, 5% (potential \$1,000). The drawing will be held the day of the event at 3 p.m. at the Clinton Elks Lodge. (More details on tickets.)

Ride for Rotary draws broadly on community talents. Hunterdon County Polytech students design the run T-shirt, park cars and help to prepare and cook some of the food. A professional clam shucker prepares the steamers and clams on the half-shell, the event's signature food offering. Face painting and other kids' activities are provided. Breakfast and picnic foods are generously donated by local businesses. #### Clinton Sunrise Rotary Club Expands its Flu Shot Clinics This Year:

The Clinton Sunrise Rotary Club and Dr. Ronald M. Frank will be expanding their Flu Vaccine Clinics this year to fill the void created by Hunterdon County Health Department's decision to eliminate their flu clinics. Currently, three large clinics are planned for northern Hunterdon County. Dates and times will be announced the first week of September. In addition, Dr. Frank will be holding two additional Flu Vaccine Clinics in Flemington.

"Clinton Sunrise Rotary is pleased to offer this service to the community in conjunction with Dr. Frank," said Dave Gansfuss, Rotary Club President. "The additional bonus of support for the Open Cupboard Food Pantry in Clinton also fits in with our club's goal of addressing Hunger in Hunterdon."

Flu vaccines will be available for adults and children 6 months of age and older. This year, a limited number of preservative-free flu vaccines will be offered. Pneumonia vaccines will be available for eligible participants. Questionnaires will be available at the clinics.

No copays or deductibles are required for participants with Traditional Medicare Part B, Medicare Advantage, Aetna PPO; AmeriHealth PPO; Cigna; HealthNet; Blue Cross Blue Shield/Horizon Products; United Healthcare/Oxford. Additional HMO/Commercial insurances without PCP listing on card may be accepted. Please present all insurance cards at the clinic to determine eligibility. For those without insurance or plans that Dr. Frank does not participate with the flu vaccine cost is \$20.00.

As with previous clinics, Dr. Frank will donate a portion of the proceeds from these clinics to the Open Cupboard Food Pantry, Clinton, NJ. Nonperishable food donations will be accepted at the clinics. For additional information call Dr. Frank's office at 732-356-0266.


