<u>Dictionaries Spark Curiosity of Clinton Public School Students (from Clinton Sunrise Rotary)</u>: If you think today's youth are only interested in the latest video game or technological advance, think again. Old-fashioned paper dictionaries have captured the interest of Clinton Public School's 3rd & 4th graders. The dictionaries were a gift from the Clinton Sunrise Rotary Club as part of Rotary's Dictionary Project. Rotarians Lynn Arnold, Megan Jones-Holt, Peter Sandrian, and Andrew West distributed the books at a school assembly in early December.

The goal of this program, which started in Savannah, GA in 1992, is to assist all students in becoming good writers, active readers, creative thinkers, and resourceful learners by providing them with their own personal dictionary. The dictionaries are a gift to each student to use at school and at home for years to come. Educators see third grade as the dividing line between learning to read and reading to learn. Nationwide, 16,968,662 children have received a dictionary to date; 2,418,522 dictionaries were given to students in 2011.

The students wrote letters to the Rotary Club thanking them for the Students Dictionary. Many expressed their appreciation to Rotary for the book. Some conveyed other sentiments. Liam wrote, "I learned the longest work in English language. Although I can't pronounce it." Bobby said, "My favorite page was page 517. It had a picture of all of the planets in our solar system." Hunter related, "I love the calendar and the outer space. Also the Presidents and the map of all of the states." The Students Dictionary is published by The Dictionary Project, Inc. and includes over 150 pages of supplemental information in the back. Key features include the Constitution of the U.S., the Declaration of Independence, brief biographies of all U. S. presidents, world maps, and information about all 50 states, countries of the world, and the planets in our solar system.

One of the CPS students' favorite discoveries was on the last page of the book – the longest word in the English language. I'm not going to tell you what that is though. Go look it up in your dictionary!

It's winter! Perfect time to compete for the "Best Soup in Hunterdon" Title!!! The Rotary Clubs of Hunterdon County will organizes the annual, Hunterdon County Rotary Soup Cook-Off every year in February at Hunterdon Central Regional High School Commons, 29 Junction Road, Flemington, NJ, 08822.

The next event will be held on Monday, February 27, 2012 from 4:30 to 7:00pm.

20 professional chefs enter their favorite soup, competing for a "Best Soup in Hunterdon County" trophy (The SOUPER Bowl). This trophy is like the "Stanley Cup" of hockey, passed on from year to year. There will be a second and a third place awards as well. Soup-lovers from all over the county are invited in to taste sample-size cups of any and all soups for admission of \$10 and a can of food for the food pantry. The soups will be accompanied by rolls and dessert prepared by Polytech Culinary Arts students. A Snow Date has been scheduled for Tuesday, February 28, 2012.

All tasters will be asked to vote for their favorite soup and winners will be announced at the end of the event. There is no entry fee for chefs. Soups must be fully prepared when brought to Commons at HCRHS - 10 gallons requested. Each soup must be labeled with the chef's (restaurant) name and contact information.

Chefs will be responsible for presentation and equipment needed to keep the soup ready to serve. Participants will be selected on a first come, first-served basis, **limited to 20 professional contestants**.

The Hunterdon County Rotary Soup Cook-Off is a community awareness project of the Rotary Clubs of Hunterdon County, dedicated to helping people in our community. **All cook-off proceeds will be donated to the food pantries of Hunterdon County to fight HUNGER IN HUNTERDON**.


