- -and Face Only a Mother Could Love.



Pedals for Progress Bicycle, Sewing Machine & Sports Equipment Collection (Sat, June 2): The annual Pedals for Progress collection will be held on Saturday, June 2, 2012. Items to be collected include <u>Used Bicycles</u> (adult and child), <u>Used Sewing Machines</u> (in working condition) and <u>Sports Equipment</u> (soccer balls, baseball gloves, etc. that can fit in the shipping containers between the bikes). The collection will take place at the **Flemington Presbyterian Church** located at 10 East Main Street in Flemington, NJ from **9am to 12noon**. The collection is sponsored by the Flemington Presbyterian Church and the Flemington Rotary Club. If there are any questions, please contact Event Chair, Joe Ziegler.


Bikes will be sent to Guatemala, Nicaragua, Albania, Ghana, Uganda and Vietnam. Please help do your part to put unused bikes to good use in the developing world.

Bikes should be rust free. Bikes with flat tires in need of some repair <u>are</u> accepted. No trikes. "Bikes for parts" are not accepted.

A \$10 cash donation is required with each bike or sewing machine. Bikes and donations are cash deductible.

Pedals for Progress, also known as P4P, collects 5000 to 7000 bicycles annually and transfers this material wealth to those more needy. To date, more than 133,500 bicycles have been shipped to developing countries in Latin America, Africa, and Eastern Europe. In these countries, the bikes are reconditioned by partner agencies and distributed at low cost to poor working adults. These bikes provide them with reliable transportation for commuting to work, transporting produce to market, or accessing health care and other services. Steady employment for these adults is vital to the development and success for these economies.

It costs \$40 to collect, process, ship, rebuild and distribute <u>each</u> bicycle. The required \$10 donation helps to offset the shipping costs. P4P is a 501(c)(3) corporation and a registered charity in the states of NJ, PA, NY, CT, IA & VT. Brochures explaining this innovative program will be available at the collection site. <u>Changing of the Guard– Save the Date (Wed, June 13th)</u>: President Chris has indicated that the Changing of the Guard will take place on Wed, June 13th at Copper Hill Country Club in place of our regular lunch meeting. Rotary International Foundation Contributions: As you know, all members are encouraged to "Donate \$100 Every Year" to the Rotary International (RI) Foundation. RI initially invests the money for a period of 3-years. After 3-years, RI uses the interest earned to run RI. Then 50% of the original contribution comes back to our Rotary District for our use in Grants, Ambassadorial Scholarships, and other District programs. The remaining 50% of the original contribution goes towards RI's international humanitarian efforts, including Polio Plus and Clean Water. Once a member has donated a total of \$1000, accrued over time, they are acknowledged with a Paul Harris Recognition. A Rotarian is considered a "sustaining member" if they consistently make a donation on a yearly basis. The money raised from the Polio Bee Hives and Polio Pigs are collected to support RI's Polio Plus program to help eliminate Polio from the world. 
