GENEROSITY SAVES LIVES AT ANNUAL BLOOD DRIVE (Sat, 7/28) – Clinton Sunrise Rotary:

Generous community members heeded the call and donated a precious gift to help others – their blood. The Clinton Sunrise Rotary's annual blood drive, held at the Clinton Firehouse on Saturday, 7/28, was a great success. New Jersey Blood Services was on hand and collected 39 units of blood. "We are pleased with the number of community members who donated blood," stated Deb Shenberger, Clinton Sunrise Rotary President. "We live in a caring community and can always count on the local residents to give of themselves to help others."

In addition to helping others, donors had the opportunity to win something for themselves as several door prizes were available. Chelsea Loftus of Clinton won a camera from Sandrian Camera in Clinton; Orlando Caponpon of Clinton received a 6 month family membership to the Hunterdon County YMCA along with a gym bag of goodies. All donors received 2 Mets tickets from NJ Blood Services and were treated to free Rita's Ice by Tom Kowal, owner of the Clinton & Flemington Rita's stores.

Every 3 seconds someone in the United States needs blood. Close to 2,000 donations are needed each day in the New York/New Jersey community for patients who require a life-saving blood and/or platelet transfusion. Those in need include cancer patients, accident, burn or trauma victims, patients undergoing surgery or a transplant, & newborn babies. "Donating blood is literally giving the gift of life," related Barbara Pearson, Account Manager for the Clinton Office of NJ Blood Services. "Our organization sincerely thanks Clinton Sunrise Rotary for coordinating a great blood drive."

ANNUAL RUBBER DUCKY RACE GOES SWIMMINGLY (Sun, 7/22) – Clinton Sunrise Rotary:

The 23rd annual Great Hunterdon Rubber Ducky Race took place on the Raritan River in Clinton on Sunday, 7/22. This fundraising event, a Clinton tradition, is run by the members of Clinton Sunrise Rotary with the help of many dedicated volunteers.

Hundreds of bright yellow rubber ducks had been in training for months hoping to bring home one of the top prizes for their sponsor. At approximately 2pm, the competitors were off on their journey over the Clinton Falls, under the bridge, dodging rocks and wayward tree limbs that threatened to keep them from a successful conclusion. The competition was fierce as the first 6 ducks made their way to the finish, sponsors and spectators cheering them on. The winning duck was sponsored by Roger Yohn & Katie Kramer of Clinton. They will be winging their way to Florida for a 4 day, 3 night Walt Disney World Package, including airfare, hotel & park passes. Other prizes included a \$500 travel voucher provided by Rotary; a gift basket full of goodies donated by businesses of the Clinton Guild, 2 - \$250 gift certificates to Clinton Falls Frame & Art Gallery; and a \$150 gift certificate from Riverside Coffee & Tea. Even the last place duck earned a prize for their sponsor – a last place trophy and a \$100 gift certificate donated by The Walker Team – Douglas & Nancy Walker of Coldwell Banker Residential Brokerage. Proceeds raised from ducky sponsorships benefit the American Cancer Society's programs of research, education, advocacy and patient/family services in the Northwest NJ Region and the gold standard programs of support, education and hope for cancer patients and their families at the Cancer Support Community Central New Jersey.


