Update Regarding the "First Response Backpacks" for Injured American Soldiers Serving In

Afghanistan: If you recall, Debbie Lavoie spoke to the Flemington Rotary Club on Wed, 8/8 about the "First Response Backpacks" she was putting together to send to wounded or ill American Soldiers serving in Afghanistan. She started the project to help cope with the stress of having her own son serving overseas. The following is a recent letter than Debbie proudly shared rom Lance Corporal Martin Ortiz. Debbie noted "Dear Friends, You have all been so generous with your time, your contributions, your efforts, and your hearts in supporting putting together backpacks for our wounded troops. I thought you would want to know that we can say that we are getting the job done. Here is a letter from one of the young men who received one of our packs. Thank you for all that you have done, and all I know we can continue to do." Here is the letter:

Dear Mrs. Lavoie,

My name is Martin Ortiz. Recently, on the 21st of august, my convoy hit an i.e.d, and i was injured as a result. I was on the turret, and was thrown around and knocked unconscious for a few seconds as a result. Got a fractured t12 on my mid spine, and a fractured tail bone. Due to my injuries, I was med-evac'ed to wounded warriors here in San Diego. fortunately, I will make a full recovery, just need plenty of time for my two fractures to heal. It took about less than a week for me to get back to the states.. but along the way, i received many gifts, including all the items you and your loved ones sent. I wanted to thank you for sending me such gifts, as they made things go by much more pleasantly. In honesty, the thank you letters were the best part for me.. i only wish everyone left behind a mailing address, so I could give them all my personal thanks. For me, as a humble softie, receiving those letters really lightened my spirits. By the way mam, I so also happen to be a Marine Combat Engineer. From my stand point, Engineers receive THE best training for ground operations. We know what to look for, to keep our brothers, and ourselves safe. things are slowing down out there as well.. What I'm really trying to say is that your son has received some top training, and will be safe. He'll bring everyone, and himself as well home safe, and all in one piece. I wish you, and your loved ones good fortune, and thank you again, for lifting my spirits in a critical part of my life.

<u>Clinton Sunrise Rotary Offers Flu Shot Clinic (Sat, 10/6)</u>: The Clinton Sunrise Rotary Club and Dr. Ronald M. Frank are offering a Seasonal Flu Shot Clinic to benefit the Open Cupboard Food Pantry. The clinic will be held on **Saturday, October 6th** from **9 am to Noon** at the Clinton Fire Department, Main Street, in the Town of Clinton. The clinic is open to adults and children from 6 months of age and older. Reservations are not required and a physician will be available to address any flu vaccine related questions.

Seniors with Traditional Medicare Part B are covered with your Traditional Medicare Card. Other selected insurance plans such as Medicare Advantage, Aetna PPO; AmeriHealth PPO; Cigna (without PCP on card); HealthNet; Blue Cross/Blue Shield-Horizon products; United Healthcare/Oxford may be accepted. Please present all insurance cards at the clinic to determine eligibility. Otherwise the cost is \$20.00 for the injectable flu vaccine and \$30 for the nasal spray vaccine (reserve your nasal spray at www.GreenBrookFamilyMedicine.com). For more information on the clinic, please call the office of Ronald M. Frank, MD at 732-356-0266. A portion of the proceeds will benefit the Open Cupboard Food Pantry, Clinton, NJ. Nonperishable food donations will also be accepted at the Clinic.

In addition to the food pantry collection, the Rotary Club will be collecting dog and cat food to benefit the non-profit organization New Jersey AniMeals, which assists those in financial need with pet supplies, in order to allow them to keep their pets.

There will also be a collection for the "First Response Backpack" program, which supplies backpacks of new items for injured servicemen overseas. This collection is spearheaded by Debbie Lavoie of Flemington, whose son, Normand, is currently an Army Combat Engineer serving in Afghanistan. The following groups will also be present at the clinic for community education:

The Town of Clinton Police Department will perform Child ID fingerprinting as well as DNA LifePrint kits. The DNA LifePrint program is a nationally recognized program meant to provide parents with a tool to collect and securely retain a sample of their child's DNA. Once collected and properly stored, the samples have an indefinite shelf life. The kits are being provided free of charge by the Town of Clinton and the Town of Clinton Police Department's Education Division which encompasses the Community Policing and D.A.R.E. Units; the Hunterdon County Sheriff's Dept will also provide community education materials; and the County Divisions of Health and Public Health Nursing will conduct a medication disposal collection, blood pressure screenings, and have information on health education and emergency preparedness.


