DOUG MERRITT ON ROTARY HOMES OF HOPE

Rotary Homes of Hope began as a program for building low-cost housing in Ecuador. The program soon expanded from building homes to building infrastructure, including, a fence around the village, a community center, and latrines.

This year is even more ambitious, with a potable water project and programs for sponsoring children's nutrition, clothing and school attendance.

Our club supported the project seriously from the beginning. Mick Shaible is currently involved and in charge of the water project. Dick Stothoff has generously agreed to provide engineering expertise to design the delivery system. One possible solution is to connect to an existing public water line about a mile away. Longterm, desalinization of brackish aquifer water is another potential solution.

One highlight of last year's program was a medical clinic which saw about 1,000 patients. Everyone in the village started their first medical chart ever, with follow-up visits every three months by American and Ecuadorian doctors. Three lives were saved last summer year, including a young person with a life-threatening spinal tumor. The clinics will be held again this summer.

This year will also include a big push for education. Children who don't have proper clothes are not allowed to attend school, but the villagers value education to the extent that some families share one set of clothing among the children, who alternate school days. Nutrition is also inadequate. Part of this project is to provide more adequate nutrition. It's hard to learn on a stomach filled only with sugar water.

The new sponsorship program for the children costs just \$400 and buys school tuition, books, supplies and clothing for a child for a year; plus a nutritious breakfast every morning; plus medical and dental checks twice a year — all this for just \$1.10 per day! Eventually the hope is that some of the village children may even be able to come to the US for higher education.

So far, those who have adopted children have committed to continue their support into the future — including several sponsors from our club. But 30 kids still need sponsors. Club members can sponsor children individually or on a pooled basis.

After his slide show, Doug recounted how a woman in the village gave him a gift which was one of her most valued possessions — a military medal that was her grandfather's — worth a small fortune in Ecuador. People there don't trust their local politicians, but are beginning to trust American Rotarians.
