#### **POLYTECH IS TRULY POLYFACETED**

Jennifer Calvelli gave an excellent presentation on the many programs offered by Polytech — in spite of Rich Van Gulik's runaway slide show.

Since statistically today's kids will change jobs about seven times in their lifetime, "What do you want to be when you grow up?" is taking on a totally new meaning.

Polytech gives young people an opportunity to try out a field they think is interesting to see if they really do like it. The stereotype is that vo-tech students don't have the skills and ability to go college, but this is far from the truth. Many of the Polytech students have figured out "what they want to do" when they enter the work force and about 70 percent of them do go on to college.

According to Jennifer, most college grads end up returning to school to learn marketable skills! And this trend is increasing.

Some Polytech programs, like the Teachers' Academy, give students actual work experience at a much earlier ages than they would have in similar college programs.

And because Polytech stays current with technology, students who go on to major in computer science in college may find that their Polytech background is actually as good or better in ways than their college courses.

Polytech has matriculation agreements with many area colleges which allow students to earn college credits while still in high school. This gives families a real financial break since Polytech credits are tuition free.

Currently, the top three fields in terms of unfilled jobs are computer technology, cosmetology and plumbing. Education and nursing are in the top ten.

Adults come to Polytech to train for new careers, taking advantage of the apprenticeship and certification programs. Many others take courses simply to gain new skills. Polytech also has classes for people who want to learn "do-it-yourself" skills for basic home repairs.
