BIG BROTHERS / BIG SISTERS

Jodi Wheeler from Big Brothers/Big Sisters spoke on the many ways in which the program helps area children, particularly those who don't have two parents at home, or who, perhaps, don't have the all the advantages we generally associate with the Hunterdon County lifestyle.

In one program, a volunteer spends three to five hours per week for one year with a child.

In some programs, couples and families are matched to children, so that they can participate in a "healthy family."

There are also programs for high school age children ages 14 to 18 to volunteer to help children in an "after-care" environment.

Employees of corporations can volunteer for BB/BS's corporate program; the commitment is one hour per week. Some corporations view this as paid community service time.

Big Brothers/Big Sisters currently has over 50 match-

es, with a waiting list of 15 boys in Hunterdon County and a waiting list for girls as well.

Often, referrals come from schools or from charitable agencies, so that there generally is a valid need for a child to be mentored. Often, single parents call.

The agency stages several events each year, to which the mentors and kids are invited, for example, a baseball game.

Often, travel with the child is welcome, since one function of BB/BS mentors is to provide children with opportunities to go places they wouldn't ordinarily go. Overnight travel is permitted after a "grace period" of one year.

Interviewing and "vetting" for all programs are meticulous and thorough, to make certain that the background of the volunteer is clean and that the match seems appropriate and constructive.

An issue has been the slowness of background checks, but the agency is seeking funding to speed this up.

Jodi provided our club members with brochures. Hopefully, some members will use this information to consider volunteering.

KEN PHILLIPS HAS US COVERED

Being in sales, Ken conducted a "sales meeting" for his classification talk, using various props and activities to dramatize his personality and profession.

ROTARY ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

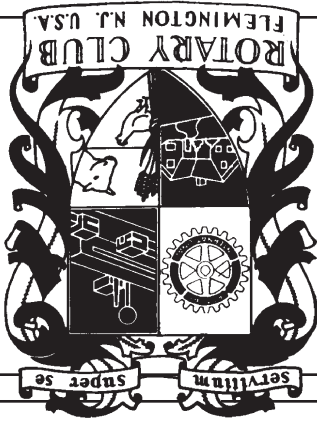
1. Attend at least **60%** of club meetings in each half of the Rotary year, including make-ups.
