PLANNING PROCESS YIELDS BIG IDEAS

Last week's club assembly led to some intriguing possibilities. Rotary International's fight against polio is significant, but are there more community service ideas we can apply locally going forward?

Rotary's four avenues of service are Club service, Community service, International service and Vocational service, and we are active in all four.

We do plenty of wonderful things, but our members often wonder if we're making the maximum impact we can. It's been suggested that perhaps we should take on one or more major projects, projects that would encourage community and business leaders to help us.

Rotarians wrote suggestions on cards distributed to all tables, and a discussion ensued.

Bob Burgard suggested a long-term project: that we attempt to stamp out hunger in Hunterdon County. We currently provide some support to the Food Pantry and Meals on Wheels, but the need is growing. The Food Pantry currently serves 800 families a month.

According to Tom Cunningham, president of the Food Pantry's board, one immediate need is for a new home for the pantry. The high real estate prices here also, unfortunately, affect the Food Pantry's search for a facility. Leasing would cost about \$35,000 a year. Purchasing property may cost \$1,000,000 or so. Moving to an area outside Flemington might save money but could make it more difficult to serve those in need.

Terry Martin suggested that Rotary help local nonprofits find land and build a facility that would serve all of them. It would be a way for charities to stabilize their costs, since rentals are escalating like real estate values.

A single community facility housing several charitable agencies could become a focal point for hunger mitigation as well as other needs. Its visibility would be a symbol of Rotary's deep commitment to our community.

Wayne Randolph's view is that we should give more money to fewer organizations. He believes we need a major project. He would like that major project to be the Food Pantry including helping them find a new home.

Harry Woske's view is that we should reach out to our Hispanic community in many ways, including helping this population receive adequate health care.

Frank Fuzo believes that as a community organization, Rotary should spread its contributions broadly and should attempt to support all who need help.

Lee Seitz pointed our that the real issue is whether we want to add a large project as a focus for some of our fundraising and contributions, or to continue as we have been, giving to a variety of organizations.

Karen Widico expressed the view that we can define and refine our focus, and that single projects and widebased community help are not mutually exclusive.

Chris Venditti believes that we should keep our options open to all people in need, with one major project, possibly the Food Pantry.

Steve Rogow questioned if the Food Pantry provided a complete safety net. He supports a major project with which the Club can be identified publicly.

Ruth O'Brien believes that our current strategy is working, but that we could keep current efforts and adopt a major project. She emphasized that we need to do a better job with our PR.

Steve Kasser indicated that often small projects using a volunteer staff can grow at a surprising rate, citing a church tutorial program near Philadelphia that expanded from one to five nights a week in just a few years.

Gwen Doremus suggested that we pool resources with other Rotary clubs.

Catherine said that, for the past ten years, the Donations Committee's guidelines have specified supporting the youth, the elderly and the disabled of our area. We can adjust that focus. If we choose to take on a major project, we can use our connections with community organizations to augment our resources.

Harry Mazujian believes support could be forthcoming from Wal-Mart, Home Depot and other major chains wanting a presence in our community. He also suggested that local political leaders could encourage local charities as part of doing business here.
