CLEAN WATER — RI'S NEXT PROJECT?

One project Rotary International is considering as its next major campaign is providing clean water for the 1.1 billion people in the world who lack it. Every day, an average of 4,700 people die because of impure drinking water. Countless people spend 90 minutes a day just fetching the water their families need for drinking and cooking. Where the average American uses over 400 liters of water per day, the world average is 30-50 liters per person.

For the one hundred billion dollars of bottled water were sold last year, 1.1 million barrels of crude oil are used to produce 2.7 million tons of plastic bottles. By contrast, it would take only \$10 billion per year to meet the United Nations goal to provide safe drinking water to half of the 1.1 billion who are without it by 2015.

FLEMINGTON ROTARY PLANNING SESSION

Our thanks to Dave Prutow, from Hunterdon Central, who facilitated for our club's planning session, and to Lee Seitz for enabling him to participate.

The club is motivated to be of greater service. How best to do this is now in the hands of a new committee which will consider all of the input from the past three club planning sessions.

During last week's session, some members voiced the opinion that we spread our donations in too many areas, and should concentrate our efforts on one major project, chosen either annually or on a long-term basis.

However, others pointed out that the community has diverse needs; that our contributions, while small, provide meaningful help; and that we should expand our giving to these and other local charities.

Others emphasized that flexibility is important because the situation in many charities changes from year to year. Suggestions for major projects included:

- Feed the hungry through Flemington Area Food Pantry and Meals on Wheels
- Drug abuse prevention and treatment
- · CEA and other services to the mentally disabled
- Homes for Hope's Clean Water project
- Services to seniors, including Briteside Adult Daycare Center
- Hispanic community, including ESL instruction
- · Increased scholarship funding
- Special Olympics
- Community center to house multiple non-profit agencies
- Increased support to all community agencies

By vote, club members clearly did not want us to lock into a multi-year project or to any funding plan that designates specific percentages or amounts of money to our various projects.

By vote, the club did approve that we consider a major project annually, based on need; that we continue our charitable support as determined by the Donations, SAC and Scholarship committees; and we support other projects as determined by the board, such as international projects.

A strategic planning committee was formed which will meet, then make recommendations to the board. If interested in serving on this committee, see Catherine. Next meeting: Tues., April 11, 6 pm, Bob Chittenden's office.
