June when he returns from a 6-week trip to China.)

"The challenge of the unprecedented personal and economic burden of a rapidly aging population with its inherent problem of how to better manage chronic disease has been described as the 'next global crisis.' This world-wide problem requires world-wide collaboration," said Warren.

"The mission of IDMA is to create an international forum of disease and health management stakeholders in order to share knowledge and to build a collective experience on how to better promote healthy lifestyles and to enhance the management of chronic disease."

"The good news is that a growing army of healthcare leaders in 30+ countries has already committed considerable expertise and resources for the purpose of identifying solutions to the approaching crisis."

Warren's presentation also dealt with short-term disease issues that are "top of mind" for many of us: Bird flu will be arriving. It is just a matter of time.

An issue many of us are not aware of is the way in which the developing world is importing fast food eating habits, particularly from the United States. As a result, obesity is becoming a major health issue in countries where previously it did not exist. There are so many other health issue prompted by obesity and related to it, including diabetes, that this trend is no laughing matter. And as always, there are economic implications to any epidemic — and obesity is an epidemic.

In the matter of polio, thanks largely to Rotary International, it has all but been eradicated. Isolated cases still show up in the US. More disturbing, there are some countries where western health officials and vaccination are not welcome due to political or religious reasons. These countries have a real problem with polio. It's a pity the poor children who suffer are doing so only because of the narrow-minded views of their leaders.

Another issue is smoking. Smoking is greatly on the decline in the United States due to regulation, taxation and a massive anti-smoking education effort. However, smoking and its ancillary diseases are still a major issue in Europe and some other parts of the world.

No question this is where much of the action is in preparing the global community for lifestyle and economic impact of an increase in chronic diseases. Anyone interested in becoming involved in world health issues through the Alliance can contact Warren.


