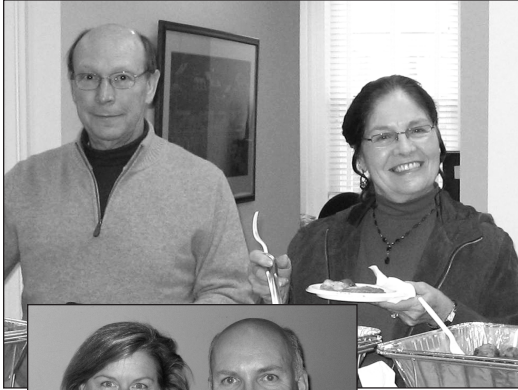

KAREN WIDICO ON UNDERAGE DRINKING

While our society is concerned with illegal drug use to the extent that it costs us billions of dollars per year to police such use and curtail the production, importation and distribution of drugs, another insidious problem stalks our society: underage drinking.

While alcohol use doesn't initially result in the same degree of violence and imprisonment as drugs, it is creating many social, behavioral and health problems — not to mention the early and tragic deaths that occur due to drinking and driving.

The current adult generation was guilty in college — as students still are — of overuse of alcohol and even binge drinking.

The more disturbing pattern today is the lower ages at which alcohol use and abuse occur. According to a recent survey of middle school students, 17.8 percent of eighth graders and 9.9 percent of seventh graders reported using alcohol some time in the past 30 days.

This jumps to 45 percent among high school students. Twenty-four percent of high school students reported indulging in binge drinking some time in the last 30 days!

"In the past month" implies continued use.

The problem is local, and not restricted to kids — Hunterdon County has the highest percentage of residents in treatment for alcohol abuse in New Jersey.

And the alcohol abuse in question is often extreme. According to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration (SAMHSA): Alcohol is the number one drug of choice among youth, killing more teens than all other drugs combined.

One of the best preventions begins at home: talk openly and talk often. Try to recognize the symptoms of alcohol abuse among friends, family and children, just as you would the symptoms of any other disease — and try to deliver or call for appropriate help.

Along with communication comes education: schools and agencies do their best, but still rely on parents, friends, relatives and neighbors. For children and teens, parents are the number one influence!

Failing to be proactive frequently "enables" abuse of alcohol to escalate, which may result in alcoholism and use other drugs. "Enablers" overlook abuse, accept excuses, or make them, to avoid dealing with the problem.


ROTARY ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS
