KILROY WAS HERE — TWICE!

Shortly after World War II, Catherine Langley's aunt, Betty Thomas, was recruited from her job at the Marshall Plan to shoot a movie — a film named "Kilroy Returns."

Since sophisticated sound stages were not available, the film was "silent" with a voice and music overdubbed later. The voice of "Kilroy" describes what it was like to return to the battlefields of Europe and see the towns and the people in a peaceful setting.

Kilroy and Betty, playing his recent bride, retraced the path of "his" war in Europe, starting at Omaha Beach and ending at the bridge at Remagen.

The tour included Saint Lo, "Le Capitale des Ruins," which was liberated on July 18, 1944 by the U.S. 29th Division but 90 percent destroyed by the battle. The battle of Saint Lo became known as the "Second D-Day." The couple spotted the church steeple, one of the few landmarks that survived the battle.

Kilroy and Betty visited a French family that hosted him during the invasion, and they enjoyed again the open-hearted hospitality of the region.

Kilroy says, "All French roads head for Paris." He continues, "The last time I saw Paris I was marching 24 abreast toward the arch (de Triumph) while the rest of the town went whooping mad over the liberation." They returned with another "invasion," the first great wave of American tourists to have visited Paris.

Kilroy and Betty visited a steel mill in France where "swords were beaten into plowshares." The remains of destroyed tanks and guns were made into household goods. They also saw American tractors and other equipment helping France back to peacetime economic health.

Retracing Kilroy's race to Germany, the couple visited the ruins of the Ludendorff Bridge at Remagen. The Rhine was the major obstacle between Allied troops and the heart of Germany, and Allied military planners never expected to find any bridges intact. However, in March, 1945, the retreating Germans' damaged but failed to destroy the bridge, which served as an open lane for American troops into Germany. Eventually, the damaged bridge collapsed, and has never been rebuilt. The towers remain, one of them on the Western bank serving as a peace museum.

In Luxembourg, the couple discovered that "distances that stretch out almost endlessly in combat shrink to almost nothingness in peacetime."

They went there to make one more important stop — the Hamm Cemetery near Luxembourg City, final home to over 5,000 "Kilroys who will never return. ... Here, beneath this flag and among these crosses, this too, was America."


ROTARY ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS
