"FLEMINGTON ROCKS" TO BENEFIT FLEMING CASTLE

Speakers Carmen Grimes and Janice Armstrong from Friends of Fleming Castle acquainted Rotarians with the Fleming Castle Rocking Chair Auction fundraiser. There will be a preview party May 18, with the auction taking place May 19.

The fundraiser celebrates Fleming Castle's 250th anniversary. Funds raised during the event will be used for improvements to the building, to establish an on-site museum and to provide educational programs about the history of Fleming Castle.

Items to be auctioned are artistically-decorated, adult-size rocking chairs that have been donated. They are currently on display at various business and organization locations throughout the community.

The Friends of Fleming Castle is a volunteer organization formed after the Borough of Flemington purchased the building at 5 Bonnell Street from the Daughters of the American Revolution in June 2005. Although the borough is responsible for maintaining the Castle, the "Friends" are working to transform it into a museum. "Flemington Rocks" is their primary fundraiser.


ROTARY ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS
