noses and treats both early and advanced symptoms of memory loss.

Their facility is called the "The Central Jersey Regional Memory Center."

"If you can remember that," Linda said, "you probably don't need our services."

There are five million Americans with some form of dementia (a symptom of a number of diseases, most commonly Alzheimer's). The largest growing segment of our population is 85 plus. And 50 percent of these people develop some form of dementia.

The boomers are just turning 60, and the aging population is truly growing, so it's important to address these problems.

Mild cognitive impairment, slight memory loss, is amenable to behavioral treatment and physical activity. The center is well aware of this holistic approach to the problem, and provides direction and support. This problem is not only a problem for the aged.

It usually involves a lessening ability to do whatever it is you're used to doing, whether that be normal life chores or a complex profession.

But that assumes a proper diagnoses for early intervention, which not all patients get. Early diagnosis is important since there are a number of effective remedies to slow progression and even some new treatments that can halt it. So the memory Center emphasizes ways of helping people with early impairment.

The Center's assessment program helps people know exactly what problem they have, what causes it, whether it's curable or not, and what to do about it. Much of this is done with sophisticated testing, which is geared to give exact diagnoses in half an hour or an hour. The tests can also be repeated to assess the progression of the problem.

In the future PET scans may give a more physical diagnosis, important because often there are physical causes like mini-strokes.

Education is also important, since the patient and family may not know what they're dealing with. Perhaps half the problems dealt with in Senior Services are instances where patients and families do not understand what is happening in early dementia.

Unfortunately, with advanced Alzheimer's the emphasis changes to caregivers and facilities. The connection with the county's nursing homes is critical.
