What not all of us might know is that Chris was also an outstanding lead actor/singer in the high school's production of "Kiss Me, Kate."

Kaitlin Ritter volunteered in Florida at a camp for disadvantaged children and realized that many of the material things we take for granted, including health, are fragile for many in the world. She will attend Muhlenberg College and hopes to become a doctor to help other people by sharing some of the gifts she's been given.

Kristine Silvestri looked around the high school and saw that, for whatever reasons, the Hispanic community was not being well integrated. She instituted a program in which Spanish-speaking students at the school would help students in Spanish classes learn the language better, and the English-speaking students will help the Hispanic students learn English and American culture so they can integrate more effectively. She will study political science at Elon College.

Kimberly Kopin, who was not able to be present, will be attending The College of New Jersey, and attained her EMT license to serve the community at an early age.

Each student was introduced and told us a bit about and their hopes and goals. Then Ted and Ken presented them with their scholarship checks — \$1,500 each, payable to their colleges.

The committee thanked Lee Seitz for the high school's support of the great activities performed by our scholarship recipients, and for the wonderful plug he gave our club during the awards presentation event!


