BOR CHITTENDEN

Bob is a natural organizer, whose enthusiasm gently recruits volunteers for projects they never dreamed they would be supporting. He is most noted as the originator of "Ride for Rotary," and jousting with Mother Nature on its behalf. When Mother cooperated, the Ride produced results. A natural leader, Bob never fails to mobilize the troops! As incoming president he's bound to do great things! As a new Dad, he's bound to imbue his son with the same pleasant and energetic genes and behaviors he always shows!

WE'RE NOT "COUNTRY" ANY MORE

Dick Stothoff personally observed many of the changes that have radically altered the scenery and the culture of Hunterdon County. Because he is a long-time resident and cares about the area he has been involved in many historical and preservation projects.

He gave a presentation showing how the last 40 years have changed Raritan Twp. from a rural farm community of 3,000 residents to 24,000 today. This change in population brought with it a massive transformation in land use. Today the township is considered to have practically no remaining open land that can be developed.

Unfortunately many beautiful, old historic farm houses and barns were lost in this change. And many of our own club members observed this first hand.

Joe O'Dwyer's old farm is now the site of approximately 150 homes. Charlie Fisher worked on an area farm (circa 1740) as a teenager and later saw the farm vandalized and the barn destroyed by fire. Dick Stothoff (age 8-12) worked with his grandfather restoring old farmhouses, barns and

Properties along our local streams and rivers were often the first ones to be settled 200-300 years ago. Sadly, when Raritan Twp. established its first master plan in the late 1960's, historic preservation was not part of the plan. Riverfront properties were converted to industrial sites, resulting in the loss of many historic houses and barns. Not until the Bicentennial did the township reverse this policy.

In a joint program with Readington Twp., a historic district was created on river frontage to preserve the remaining 1700's buildings. Among the most dedicated preservationists in Hunterdon County, our own Dick Stothoff has been a driving force in rescuing countless historic buildings through private purchase, renovation, relocation or whatever it takes.

Modest as always, Dick would probably not mention the tremendous impact he has had on the environment and quality of life we enjoy.
