World War II remembered

John Zullo, a member of the "greatest generation of Americans", told us of his recollection the experiences during the 1940's.

On December 7, 1941, he was a student at Columbia University in New York. He completed his B.S. in 1942 and stayed on to get his masters. He recalls meeting a professor one day and discussing the aspects of nuclear reaction. It turned out that he was Enrico Fermi who was setting up the Manhattan Project under the stadium seats on the Columbia Campus. Fermi had immigrated to the US after being awarded the 1938 Nobel Prize for Physics. Later, it was determined that it may be too dangerous in the city of New York, so the "Manhattan Project" was moved to Chicago. John tried to join the Navy ROTC program but failed the vision test since he is color blind.

After getting his Masters Degree in 1943 and memorizing the right responses to the color blind test, he was able to join the Navy enlisted ranks as a radio tech, serving aboard an APA (Troop Transport). He recalls being enroute to the Philippines in 1945 in a convoy of ships taking troops to prepare for the invasion of Japan. One of the ships in the convoy was the jeep carrier, **Indianapolis**. Aboard was the product of the "Manhattan Project", so it diverted to the island of Tinian to deliver the BOMB to the Air Corps. After unloading the weapon, the **Indianapolis** proceeded unescorted and was sunk by a Japanese submarine.

John recalls that dropping the atom bomb was decisive in ending the war. It probably saved the lives of 5 million men, Allies and Japanese, if the invasion of Japan had gone forward.


