PROGRAM-Plants in New Jersey

Hank Snyder from Stanton gave an interesting program on where most of our cultivated plants come from and how they relate to our county.

Using visual aids, Hank described the 4 basic areas where our cultivated plants come from and they are Mexico/South America known as the "Farm house dinner", Italy/Himalayan Mountains known as the "Giant salad bowl", Asia known as the "Mother of gardens" and Malaysia/Thailand known as the "Home of citrus fruits".

Under British rule, Hunterdon County was known as a Bread Colony. After the Revolutionary War, the county specialized in Iron ore and old forge mills can still be seen along our rivers and above Spruce Run reservoir. The next 60 years after the Civil War, we were in the Peach Era. Pittstown was a key area for peaches in the county. From about 1910 the dairy and poultry industry began to grow and therefore oats, wheat and hay became a popular item to grow. Today we are in an era of ornamental horticulture and we still grow some grains and raise cattle.

Hank closed the program with "We have the world at our garden in Hunterdon County".
