THE BUDGET FOR THE 2007-08 ROTARY YEAR

The Budget and Finance Committee struggled with the budget for the upcoming year. It was presented to the Board of Directors last week, and after review, was approved to present to the club for a vote.

Essentially, the budget must reflect the separation of operating income and expenses from the fundraising and donations income and expenses. The idea is that we fundraise for the benefit of the good works that we do locally and internationally.

The dues that we pay and the happy dollars that are collected are used for our operating expenses. The cost to the club for each member is about \$140.00 per year; \$55 to the District and \$85 to Rotary International. Running the club (administration) takes up another \$110 per member.

In order to keep the lunches at a reasonable level, \$13.00 per member, we have to guarantee a minimum number of meals every Wednesday of 47. If only 40 Rotarians come to the meeting, we lose money. So the lunch account does not generate the surplus that it used to.

The net result is that we have to increase the annual dues from \$200.00 to \$250.00.

The support that you give to our fundraisers enables this Rotary Club to do the good work that we do. From Major Annual Donations, to International Projects, to Community Service programs like the Service Action Committee (SAC), to Scholarships, you are the reason that they are successful. Whether it is **Pancake Day**, **Ride for Rotary** or the **Golf Outing**, you have worked hard to make them successful.

4. Make up missed meetings within **14** days, before or after absence.

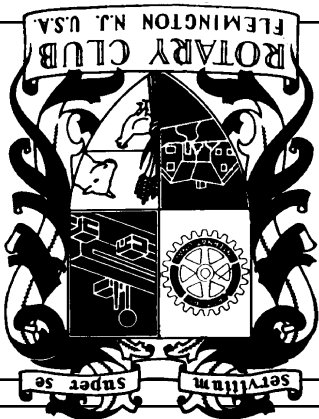
