No, we're not meeting in Vladivostok!

Our Rotary zone has been realigned. In January, three districts were moved to a zone that includes most of Canada, Alaska and Russia east of the Urals.

Rotary International bylaws require a zone realignment every eight years to ensure equal population. At their January meeting, board members voted to realign the 34 global zones. The Americas from Argentina to the northern tip of Canada lost two zones. Europe gained one zone due to growth in Eastern Europe, and Asia gained one due to growth in India and Korea.

Each zone has multiple districts. Flemington, in District 7510, is part of zone #32, which includes New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, parts of Pennsylvania, New York and West Virginia.

In the reassessment, some American zones were found to be less than half the size of the largest zones in other parts of the world. Turns out, we are one of the two smallest zones in the United States. The other is zone #31 (mostly New England).

Zone #32 used to have 17 districts. Now it has 21 districts with 38,399 Rotarians.
