Hughes to speak at Clinton Rotary meeting

Dr. James Hughes, dean of the Bloustein School of Planning and Public Policy, will speak at the North Hunterdon Rotary Club meeting this Friday at noon at Beaver Brook Country Club in Clinton. His topic: "New Jersey in an Increasingly Uncertain National Economy."

Dr. Hughes is a nationally recognized academic expert on demographics, housing, and regional economics, and was a contributing editor to American Demographics from 1982 to 1996. He is author or co-author of 33 books and monographs and more than 125 articles, focusing on housing, demographics, and economic development patterns.

Google joins fight against polio

The Google Foundation has given a \$3.5 million challenge grant in support of Rotary International's top goal to eradicate polio worldwide. As with the recent Gates Foundation grant, Rotary will raise funds to match the Google grant dollar-for-dollar over one year.

The grant and matching funds will directly support polio immunization activities carried out by the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, a partnership spearheaded by the World Health Organization, Rotary International, UNICEF, and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Did you know?

- There are 1.2 million Rotary members worldwide who belong to 32,000 Rotary clubs in about 170 countries.
- Rotary sponsors the largest privately funded international scholarship program in the world. Since its inception, 34,000 students from 100 countries have become Rotary's cultural ambassadors. They use the skills they acquire from their studies abroad to help their communities.
- Nearly one billion people lack access to clean water. Rotary clubs have helped bring wells, water tanks, school and hospital water systems, and sanitary facilities to communities worldwide.
- More than 800 million people cannot read or write. One of Rotary's main thrusts is to promote literacy.

Cyber bullying on the rise in Hunterdon

Encountering pedophiles is not the only landmine for kids on today's Internet. Here in Hunterdon County, a growing problem is bullying – kids writing harassing messages and using cell phones to take compromising photos of other people, then posting them online. One such incident in Allentown, Penn., recently led to a teenager's death.

Kids are using harassing, offensive language, often severe enough to warrant prosecution, said Katie Bergacs, associate executive director of Hunterdon Prevention Resources. She delivered a talk about online safety during last week's Rotary meeting

The solution lies with parents who need to teach responsibility – that demoralizing someone else can have dire consequences. What can a parent do to protect a child from cyber bullying?

- Teach them not to respond to harassing messages.
- Save all evidence of bullying. Don't just be offended and delete it.
- When it happens, set up new e-mail and social networking accounts.
