Compelling talk on hospice

Some of Anne Boyle's caregiving experiences are indelible in her mind. Take, for instance, the dying woman whose husband talked at length about his Russian POW days in World War II. Talking helped him deal with his wife's impending death, and Anne was mesmerized by the stories. It was a meaningful sharing on both sides.

Such are the experiences of volunteers for Hunterdon Hospice. Anne is among 150 active volunteers who work with dying patients referred to Hunterdon Hospice. At last week's Rotary meeting, she and Volunteer Coordinator Joy Stump spoke about the program, how to be referred as a patient, and how to become a volunteer.

Joy said any referral must be approved by a doctor. The patient must have a terminal illness with a life expectancy of six months or less.

Hospice is not a place," said Joy. "It is a philosophy of "care, not cure." For people in the final phase of a life-threatening illness, hospice provides control of pain and symptoms


