InterCity Dinner Update

Sign-ups for the multi-club dinner began last week. Bring your spouse or a community guest to our special dinner for all five Hunterdon County Rotary clubs on April 22 at Beaver Brook Country Club. The 6 p.m. event is sponsored by North Hunterdon and the night's program will be the Group Study Exchange (see below, "Italians are coming!").

The dinner is in lieu of our regular club meeting that week. (No meeting April 23.) The cost is \$22 per person, \$9 more than the normal weekly lunch. Assistant Lunch Treasurer Tom Thatcher will collect the difference and any guest fees. Sign-ups after April 15 will be \$25 per person.

Polytech added to scholarships recipients

Five outstanding high school seniors will receive \$1,500 each in Flemington Rotary Scholarships in late May. For the first time, one Polytech student will be among the recipients, along with four students from Hunterdon County Central High. In the past, all five scholarships have gone to Central students.

The winners are chosen based on academic achievement, need, service to the community and an essay on the value of their service. Applications are distributed at the schools and Rotary Scholarship Committee members serve as the judges.

Funding for the scholarships comes from the club's general fund and from golf tournament proceeds.

The Italians are coming!

Five special Italian visitors are coming soon to our area, part of a month-long Group Study Exchange experience in New Jersey (April 14 to May 12).

The visitors will be staying in the homes of District 7510 Rotarians, including our own Gwen Williams. The team includes a musician, two lawyers and an auto sales manager accompanied by one Rotary team leaders.

On May 12, the American team will join the Italians on the plane back to Italy as they start their outbound trip to Italy, through June 9. The American team includes an executive chef, an accountant, a printer, an educator and an architect. Gwen and Barbara Evans of Princeton Corridor club are the GSE co-chairs and part of the outbound team.

The GSE program is a cultural and vocational exchange for businesspeople and professionals between ages 25 and 40 in the early stages of their careers. Team members experience the host country's culture and institutions, observe how their vocations are practiced abroad, and develop personal and professional relationships.


