Our top prize was split between high schooler Treacey Everitt of Ringoes, who made a potato dill soup, and Claudia Kennington from Raritan Township, who made a creamy crab soup. They divided the \$250 gift card donated by Commerce Bank of Flemington.

Second prize went to Glenn Tutko of Flemington, one of the staff here at Copper Hill County Club. For his delicious lobster bisque, he won a \$100 gift certificate to Grand Colonial Restaurant in Hampton.

Third prize went to Barbara Merlini of Whitehouse Station, who made a bacon and cheese baked potato soup. She won the \$50 gift certificate from Lo-Fatt-Chow in Ringoes.

What you need to know Hunterdon

More than 11,000 Hunterdon County residents are negatively impacted by abuse or dependence on drugs, alcohol and tobacco. Among our youth, the average age of first alcohol use has reduced from 12 to 11.

So said Karen Widico, Rotary member and a team coordinator for A Partnership for Health, a coalition of county social services agencies. During last week's club meeting, Karen spoke about a new Web site, www.what you need to know hunterson.com. The site was developed by the Partnership as an abuse eye-opener and a source of solutions for all Hunterdon residents.

The through a community needs assessment, the Partnership identified four top concerns: substance abuse and tobacco, cardiovascular disease, weight management/obesity and mental illness. Regarding substance abuse in particular, they found the following:

• Hunterdon County has the second highest number of drinkers in New Jersey.

- 46% of our substance abuse treatment admissions are for alcohol abuse compared to 27% statewide.
- Nearly 44% of county adults who drink admit to driving drunk two or more times a month.

Most alarming of all, said Karen, is our underage drinking problem.

- 78.6% of Hunterdon County youth have at least one drink of alcohol per month.
- 46% of ninth grade males have at least one drink per month, compared to 40% nationwide.
- 52% of eleventh grade females have at least one drink a month compared to 46% nationwide.

Karen said 95% of youth problems occur because of parental denial. Many parents blame peer pressure for their kids' negative behavior. But the number one reason for youth risk-taking is lack of parental guidance. Instead of facing behavioral problems, too many parents deny that their children could engage in risky behavior. Kids want their parents' guidance more than peer approval, but too many parents are shirking their duty.
