#### **Rotary backs video gaming**

But it costs plenty to be a gamer -- \$50 for the average new game and at least \$250 for gaming hardware. The library created "Mediatech" to make the technology accessible to everyone.

That's where Flemington Rotary comes in. We were one of the donors who contributed to the \$14,000 start-up cost. An article about Mediatech appeared in the June issue of School Library Journal, and Rotary's contribution was acknowledged.

# Club hosts 15 exchange students at the beach

Karen Widico (with the help of Gwen and Jim Williams) hosted 15 Rotary exchange students at her beach home on the Jersey shore, May 31 and June 1. Students from our district and several surrounding districts participated, including some outbound Americans heading abroad this August. The students have enjoyed group events throughout the school year.

It was "great fun," said Karen. "TONS of food, and happy campers all around!" But she admitted surprise at the need for additional food shopping after laying in massive quantities before the group arrived.

The weekend theme was "Bridging Cultures." Karen said, "That is what the exchange student program is all about: enhancing both an understanding and acceptance of different cultures."

#### How's this for a Rotary project?

"Fit 2007" was a six-month fitness challenge sponsored by District 6360 (in Michigan). The annual program helps participants develop lifelong exercise habits. Last year, 1,800 people in southwest Michigan committed themselves to physical activities such as walking, mowing the lawn and biking for at least 30 minutes a day, five days a week. Participants recorded the number of minutes they exercised each day on the Fit 2007 Web site. About 1,000 of them recorded more than 4.7 million minutes of exercise and one third reported improved fitness habits.
