## Check the record on polio eradication

Rotary began Polio Plus in 1985 as a promise to the children of the world. Since then, polio cases have declined by 99%, thanks largely to Rotarians around the world who have committed \$650 million toward polio eradication. Five million children are walking who would have been paralyzed and more than 1.5 million lives have been saved. None of it would have been possible without Every Rotarian, Every Year, the R.I. Foundation initiative that seeks a personal contribution from every member for the Foundation's Annual Programs Fund.

# **Rotarians inspired by French adventurer**

Frenchman Jean-Gabriel Chelal is pedaling around world -- on land and water – and he's sharing his inspiration with Rotarians along the way.

The 27-year-old engineer and freelance journalist began his journey in January, when he biked from his home in Paris to Lagos, Portugal. From there on Mar. 7, he began a 65-day trip across the Atlantic in a pedal boat.

On Sept. 9, he began cycling from Florida to the eastern tip of Alaska, and from there, he'll get back in the pedal boat to cross the Bering Strait. In the final leg, he'll cycle across Siberia and Europe.

Chelal is aiming to be the first person to circumnavigate the globe using only human power.

Though he's had plenty of adventures, solitude on the open ocean has been his biggest challenge. "It gets lonely," he said in an Aug. 21 article in the Miami New Times. "I miss my family. I miss being around people. You realize how much you need to talk to someone, anyone."

Why is he doing it? "I want to remind people to dream," he says. "This is a human adventure — challenging myself against the elements."

He ran out of funds in Saint Martin and sought out the local Rotary Club for assistance. Members were impressed and named him a club ambassador. After that, he added stops at other Rotary clubs to his agenda.

In Puerto Rico, Chelal met John Richardson, assistant governor of District 7000, who was inspired by Chelal's determination and positive message.

"We concluded that he should connect to [Rotary's] global network and share his message, which is so much like our own," said Richardson. "An ordinary person armed with the strength of his conviction can pedal around the globe in much the same way as, [with] Rotary -- ordinary people do extraordinary things."

# 30 days in glorious Italy

Along the way, they visited 96 Rotary clubs and were treated to such incredible hospitality that DiNardo gained 12 pounds.

His slides showed the places they visited, some of the people who hosted them, and the dedicated pursuits of Italians in the same professions as the five American ambassadors. DiNardo said he was continually impressed by the care the Italians use in making everything from balsamic vinegar and parmesan cheese, to Lamborghinis, bells and marble flooring.


