District Governor Alexander Cauwels made his official visit at last Wednesday's (3/3) Rotary meeting. Alexander is a native of Belgium. He attended elementary school through high school in his hometown of Eeklo. He came to The United States of America in August 1998. The move from Europe to the U.S.A. was initiated by a job transfer for his wife Karlien. Alexander and Karlien have 3 children: Alexander Jr.(17), Aristo (16) and Lara (10). Alexander's first experience with community service was his father, who was a founding member of the local Kiwanis chapter in Eeklo. Alexander joined the local Rotaract Club at the age of 18. Over the next 11 years he held every possible board position with the exception of secretary and treasurer, ending his last year in Rotaract as club president. Due to age restrictions he had to resign from Rotaract in 1991. After Rotaract, he hoped to join Rotary, however, in Europe, you need to be invited in order to join Rotary. This is a difference in membership between the USA and Europe. In 1999 he joined the Rotary Club of the Princeton Corridor. Alexander shared a poem and a true story while at our club. If you missed them or want to read them again, they are as follows:

<u>Audrey Hepburn Poem</u>: The following is a poem that Audrey Hepburn wrote when asked to share her "beauty tips". It was read at her funeral a few years later:

For attractive lips, speak works of kindness.

For lovely eyes, seek out the good in people.

For a slim figure, share your food with the hungry.

For beautiful hair, let a child run his/her fingers through it once a day.

For poise, walk with the knowledge that you never walk alone. People, even more than things, have to be restored, revived, reclaimed, and redeemed; never throw out anyone.

Remember, if you ever need a helping hand, you will find one at the end of each of your arms.

As you grow older, you will discover that you have two hands; one for helping yourself, and the other for helping others.

<u>His Name Was Fleming</u>: This is the second story that Alexander shared:

His name was Fleming, and he was a poor Scottish farmer. One day, while trying to make a living for his family, he heard a cry for help coming from a nearby bog. He dropped his tools and ran to the bog.

There, mired to his waist in black muck, was a terrified boy, screaming and struggling to free himself. Farmer Fleming saved the lad from what could have been a slow and terrifying death.

The next day, a fancy carriage pulled up to the Scotsman's sparse surroundings. An elegantly dressed nobleman stepped out and introduced himself as the father of the boy Farmer Fleming had saved.

'I want to repay you,' said the nobleman. 'You saved my son's life.'

'No, I can't accept payment for what I did,' the Scottish farmer replied waving off the offer. At that moment, the farmer's own son came to the door of the family hovel.

'Is that your son?' the nobleman asked.

'Yes,' the farmer replied proudly.

'I'll make you a deal. Let me provide him with the level of education my own son will enjoy. If the lad is anything like his father, he'll no doubt grow to be a man we both will be proud of.' And that he did.

Farmer Fleming's son attended the very best schools and in time, graduated from St. Mary's Hospital Medical School in London, and went on to become known throughout the world as the noted Sir Alexander Fleming, the discoverer of Penicillin.

Years afterward, the same nobleman's son who was saved from the bog was stricken with pneumonia.

What saved his life this time? Penicillin

The name of the nobleman? Lord Randolph Churchill His son's name? Sir Winston Churchill


