The <u>Hunterdon Central Regional High School Awards & Scholarship Presentations</u> occurred last Thursday evening (5/13) at H.C.R.H.S. Ted Weinstein and Chris Kamnitsis attended to present the following scholarships to graduating seniors. Each student received a \$1500 scholarship from Flemington Rotary towards their college education. Below is information on the four (4) recipients. These students will be present at tomorrow's Club Meeting.

<u>James Bowen – Lehigh Valley (Bio Chemistry) \$1500 Scholarship</u>: Aside from obtaining an over 4.0 grade point average, James is involved heavily in class council and is President of Interact, a Rotary sponsored organization. This allowed him to participate in many fundraising events such as Family Fun Night, Rotary Pancake Breakfast, and the first annual Hair Cut-athon which raised money for the Debbie Harris comfort Fund and collected hair for wigs to be used by women who have lost their hair due to

their cancer treatments. He also organized a Dog Show to raise money for St. Hubert's Animal Shelter and even dressed like Santa Claus for the Senior Luncheon!

<u>Heather Wehrle – University of Maryland (Elementary Education) \$1500 Scholarship</u>: Heather obtained a better than 4.0 grade point average whole being Captain of both her fencing team and the Color Guard. What caught our attention in the Rotary Club was her volunteer service in several areas. Heather participated with her church to help repair and rebuild homes in an economically depressed town in Maine. She also was heavily involved in Girl Scouts which put together a family day for over 300 soldiers returning from Iraq and also mentored two families from Africa here as refugees. There is no doubt that Heather will use her major in Elementary Education to teach tomorrow's youth about service and giving back to ones community.

<u>Jeffrey Chen – New York University (Marketing) \$1500 Scholarship</u>: Obtaining good grades while playing on the Central tennis team, Jeffrey is also president of the local Chapter of Future Business Leaders of America. He volunteered at the local food pantry, raised money for the March of Dimes Foundation and tutored fellow students weekly that were struggling with various subjects through the National Honors Society. Jeffrey has clearly shown why he is deserving of our scholarship by excelling personally while making significant contributions to our community.

<u>Isabel Esparza – University of Delaware (Animal Sciences) \$1500 Scholarship</u>: Isabel works tirelessly in school and the local community. She has been volunteering at the Hunterdon Medical Center on a weekly basis since 2008, and is the Vice President of People and Animals working Side by Side where she not only helped raised money for local animal shelters, but during trips helped clean the shelters and socialize the animals. On a special note, Isabel will be the first person in her family to attend college, and we at Rotary are proud to assist her in that achievement.

The <u>H.C. Polytech Awards & Scholarship Presentations</u> will take place next Wed, 5/26 at 6pm. Flemington Rotary will be presenting the following scholarships next week. Both Emily and Bryan will also be guests at tomorrow's meeting, but they will not receive their checks until the presentation next week.

Emily Zakrzewski – Raritan Valley Community College (Registered Nursing Program) \$1500 Scholarship: Emily is a senior at HCRHS and is enrolled in the nursing program at Hunterdon County Polytech. She is currently Vice President for the National Technical Honor Society and is involved with multiple student organizations at Polytech. Emily has achieved the highest award in Girl Scouts, which is the "Gold Award" by conducting two blood drives and working with NJ Blood Services. In her spare time, she teaches dance to young girls and currently works at ProCare Physical Therapy. After graduation, Emily plans to begin her post-secondary education at Raritan Valley Community College by enrolling in the Registered Nursing Program.

**Bryan Wiszniewski – School of Visual Arts in New York; \$500**: Bryan is currently a senior and is in the Commercial Arts & Animation program at the Hunterdon County Polytech as taught by Mrs. Teresa Diaz. Bryan was among many students from the Commercial Arts & Animation as well as Mrs. Dana Huber's Graphic Arts program that competed to be the selected artist for the 2010 Ride for Rotary t-shirts. **Pedals for Progress Bicycle, Sewing Machine & Sports Equipment Collection (Sat, June 5)**: Joe Ziegler has asked us to mark our calendars for Saturday, June 5 to help collect **Used Bicycles** (adult and child), **Used Sewing Machines** (in working condition) and **Sports Equipment** (soccer balls, baseball gloves, etc. that can fit in the shipping containers between the bikes). The collection will take place at the **Flemington Presbyterian Church** located at 10 East Main Street in Flemington, NJ from **9am to 12noon**.

Pedals for Progress, also known as P4P, collects over 11,000 bicycles annually and transfers this material wealth to those more needy. To date, more than 117,000 bicycles have been shipped to developing countries in Latin America, Africa, and the Pacific Islands. In these countries, the bikes are reconditioned by partner agencies and distributed at low cost to poor working adults. These bikes provide them with reliable transportation for commuting to work, transporting produce to market, or accessing health care and other services. Steady employment for these adults is vital to the development and success for these economies.


