Attendance: Since we have had low attendance at recent club meetings, it has been requested that the E-Monger start to list the meeting attendance. The following is the most recent club attendance that is available to date:

- 10/20 Club Meeting: 30 out of 57 members attended (52.6% attendance).

Pancake Day Meeting (Wed, 11/3 at 1:30pm): Terry Ownes has called a Pancake Day follow-up meeting to have a post discussion of last Saturday's Pancake Day at 1:30pm following the regular club meeting.

Pancake Day Follow-Up Report: Pancake Day Chair, Terry Ownes, hopes to give a report on last Saturday's very successful Pancake Day at tomorrow's club meeting. Terry noted that Joe Ziegler counted 873 first time pancake servings at the door. Allowing for seconds and thirds, as well as meals for the working Rotarians, it is estimated we served approximately 1000 orders! That's 3,000 pancakes, which coincides with the consumption of 12 buckets of pancake batter (50 gallons). Everyone that attended had a fantastic time!!! 44 out of 57 members helped on Friday night and/or Saturday (77.2% of the club).

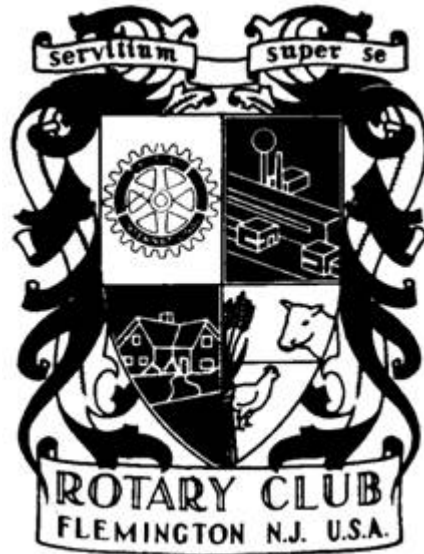
