The Commons is near Hunterdon Central's field house located at 29 Junction Road, Flemington, NJ 08822.

Net proceeds of this year's Pancake Day will benefit scholarships for H.C.R.H.S. & H.C. Polytech graduating seniors and the Filippini family of Readington Township. **Hayley Filippini**, a very active, strong willed and extremely courageous 8th grader, was diagnosed earlier this year with high-risk Pineoblastoma. A pineoblastoma is a rare malignant brain tumor, which arises from the cells of the pineal gland that sits near the center of the head and brain. This aggressive cancerous tumor has also spread down Hayley's spine. She has been undergoing radiation and intensive chemotherapy treatment. Proceeds will help Hayley and her family in their daily fight against cancer.

Rotary is continuing their "spooked" up menu with their **Boo-Berry** & **Count Chocula** Pancakes for all ages to enjoy!!!!!

This year's special activities will include an indoor *Halloween High School*, sponsored by Hunterdon Central as a "thank you" to the community for their support of the high school. The Halloween High School is free to kids Kindergarten through Grade 3 from 10am to 12noon. There will be Haunted House decorated hallways, children's scary story time and all kinds of Halloween activities and games in different classrooms. Kids and their parents can come together and there will be prizes and gifts to families and kids who come in costume. "We are pleased to be able to partner with Flemington Rotary during their popular Pancake Day," said Acting Superintendent Chris Steffner. "Parents can enjoy a pancake breakfast while their little ones have a chance to enjoy some Halloween fun with our high school students and staff. There is no charge for the Halloween High School activity. Families can participate in Halloween High school without having breakfast but we are hoping that they may choose to do both."

"In addition to the flapjacks flying and sausage sizzling on Saturday, October 29, we will also have a *Bake Sale* for all to enjoy!" The Bake Sale will offer tempting cookies, candy, cakes, pies and pastries made by Rotary members and their spouses.




