The next event will be held on Monday, February 27, 2012 from 4:30 to 7:00pm.

20 professional chefs enter their favorite soup, competing for a "Best Soup in Hunterdon County" trophy (The SOUPER Bowl). This trophy is like the "Stanley Cup" of hockey, passed on from year to year. There will be a second and a third place awards as well. Soup-lovers from all over the county are invited in to taste sample-size cups of any and all soups for admission of \$10 and a can of food for the food pantry. The soups will be accompanied by rolls and dessert prepared by Polytech Culinary Arts students. A Snow Date has been scheduled for Tuesday, February 28, 2012.

All tasters will be asked to vote for their favorite soup and winners will be announced at the end of the event. There is no entry fee for chefs. Soups must be fully prepared when brought to Commons at HCRHS - 10 gallons requested. Each soup must be labeled with the chef's (restaurant) name and contact information.

Chefs will be responsible for presentation and equipment needed to keep the soup ready to serve. Participants will be selected on a first come, first-served basis, **limited to 20 professional contestants**.

The Hunterdon County Rotary Soup Cook-Off is a community awareness project of the Rotary Clubs of Hunterdon County, dedicated to helping people in our community. **All cook-off proceeds will be donated to the food pantries of Hunterdon County to fight HUNGER IN HUNTERDON**.



NO ENTRY FEE

Simply arrive to the Commons with 10 gallons of your fully prepared soup and the equipment you need to keep your soup ready to serve. We'll provide an undraped 3 x 6 table, two electrical outlets, cups and spoons.

Be sure to have promotional materials and displays to promote your restaurant. We'll acknowledge the **BEST VISUAL PRESENTATION** so be creative in your table presentation. - 1. Participating restaurants must be located in Hunterdon County.
- 2. **Registration deadline is January 31, 2012**. Entry is limited to the first 20 respondents.
- 3. Confirmation will be sent via email.
- 4. There is **no fee** to enter your soup.
- 5. One soup entry per restaurant. Restaurant must provide at least **10 gallons** of entered soup.
- 6. Restaurants must provide all equipment, promotional signage and materials for visual presentation. **Best visual presentation will be acknowledged.**
- 7. Restaurants will be provided with the following: one 3' x 6' undraped table, two electrical outlets for set-up, cups and spoons, tabletop sign indicating description of your soup as indicated on your registration form, tabletop tent signs to display in your restaurant leading up to event (encourage your customers to attend event and vote for your soup).
- 8. Set-up time will be from 3:00-4:30 p.m. General public will begin arriving at 4:30pm. Event runs through 7:00 p.m. with winners announced at the end of the event.
- 9. Location is in the "Commons" at Hunterdon Central Regional High School located at 29 Junction Road (Old Route 523), Flemington, New Jersey.
- 10. In case of a school closing, the event will be rescheduled to Tuesday, February 28, 2012.
