Changing of the Guard Dinner Follow-Up: The Changing of the Guard Dinner was an excellent time last Wednesday (6/13/2012) at the Copper Hill Country Club. The evening also included the presentation of several awards. The following is a summary of the 2011-12 award recipients:

**2011-12 Rotarian of the Year (Lynn Hyman)**: The Rotarian of the Year (ROTY) award is the highest honor given annually to the member that has provided the most significant "Service Above Self" contribution to the 5 Avenues of Service over the most recent Rotary year. The 5 Avenues of Service are: Club Service, Community Service, International Service, Vocational Service and New Generations (a new service avenue recently approved by Rotary International on April 28, 2010). The recipient is selected by the ROTY Committee, which consists of all prior recipients of the award. The award was presented by Herb Bohler, who is last year's ROTY recipient. Lynn will be the presenter of next year's award, and so on. **Congratulations, Lynn!!!** 

**2011-12 Paul Harris Fellow (Mick Schaible)**: The Paul Harris Fellow (PHF) award is an annual award given to the member that has provided a significant "Service Above Self" contribution to the 5 Avenues of Service over their entire history of being in the club. The recipient is selected by the PHF Committee, which consists of all prior members of the award. **Congratulations, Mick!!!** 

The Paul Harris Fellow Award, as presented by Flemington Rotary, is not to be confused with the Paul Harris Fellow Recognition, which all members receive automatically after contributing \$1000 or more to the Rotary International Foundation for the "Annual Programs" fund. Most members contribute to the RI Foundation via the "Every Rotarian, Every Year" program by giving \$100 annually to the Foundation.

<u>2011-12 Distinguished Service (Joe Ziegler)</u>: The Distinguished Service award is annually presented by the current Club President based upon a members significant contributions to the club as viewed through their eyes. The Club President is in continual contact with club members and is aware of the contributions that each members make, even if those contributions are not readily noticed by all other members. Again, thank you all very much, Harrie Copeland <u>Clinton Sunrise Rotary Press Release (Sponsors Needed For Clinton Traditions)</u>: The Clinton Sunrise Rotary is pleased to announce the continuance of (2) Clinton traditions: the **23rd annual Rubber Ducky Race** on <u>Sunday, July 22nd</u> and the **33rd annual Sprintin Clinton**, a 5K race and 1 mile fun run/walk scheduled for Saturday, October 27th.

Historically, these 2 events have been held on the same day. This year the decision was made to move the 5K race to a cooler time of year.

"Our Rubber Ducky event day begins early," stated Lynn Arnold, Clinton Sunrise Rotary Rubber Ducky Race Director. "We perform various duties from helping with duck sponsor sales to wading around in the south branch of the Raritan River, guiding the ducks in their race to the finish line!"

Individuals can sponsor a duck for \$10 and have the opportunity to win one of several great prizes. First prize is a 4 day, 3 night Walt Disney World Package for two (includes air for 2, hotel, & Park Passes). Proceeds from this event benefit the American Cancer Society and the Cancer Support Community CNJ.

Commercial sponsorships are also available. There are various sponsorship levels ranging from \$100 to \$2,500 for a Presenting Sponsor. Sponsors can receive double media exposure as, depending on the sponsorship level, they may be highlighted at both events.

"The Clinton Sunrise Rotary has been a viable part of the North Hunterdon community for many years," stated Dave Gansfuss, Clinton Sunrise Rotary President. "Our members work together to address both the needs of our local community and in the international arena. Locally, we have provided financial support to various community agencies such as the Open Cupboard Food Pantry and the Clinton Fire & Rescue Squads. In addition, we provide scholarships for local high school students; collaborate with Hunterdon County Polytech to bring the "Bridging the Gap" program, an educational business skills workshop, to the students; conduct an annual flu shot clinic and an annual blood drive; contribute to the safety of our children and community by purchasing & donating a "Speed Caution" sign for the town of Clinton; and assisting local residents in need with emergency funding. Internationally, we sponsor "Polio Plus" - a Rotary program whose aim is to eradicate polio worldwide; and we support the "Homes of Hope" project in Ecuador building low-cost housing for single mothers and their families."

- A keyword search for clubs. This search looks for the keyword in either the club name or meeting location address. This is useful for finding clubs that are outside of the 100-mile radius from your current location.
- A map showing a club's location and driving directions.
- The ability to save search results to a list of favorite clubs.
- The ability to add a club to your phone's contact list.
- The club's website and primary phone number, if available.

- The names of the current club president & club secretary, along with phone & email contact info.
- A search function to find clubs by district.


