John noted the Food Pantry's new location (behind the Walmart / Lowe's complex off Route 31) is anticipated to be ready in September, pending final inspections and approvals.


Donald Bowlby (1919 – 2012): It is with sadness that we share the news that Don Bowlby passed away last Friday, (6/29) at the age of 93. Don was a prior long time Flemington Rotarian, having received the Paul Harris Fellow Award in June of 1997. The following is a note from D.J. Wright:

RARITAN TOWNSHIP, NJ - RARITAN TOWNSHIP, NJ - **Donald Bowlby**, age 93 years, of Raritan Township, NJ, died on Friday, June 29, 2012 in the Hunterdon Medical Center, Raritan Township, NJ.

Born in Somerville, NJ, April 28, 1919, son of the late Ralph and Ida May Petty Bowlby, he was a lifelong area resident. A graduate of Somerville High School, Don owned and operated the Bowlby Farm in Raritan Township, NJ.

A humble, yet very community orientated man, Don was very involved in various organizations. He was member of the Flemington Rotary Club, joining in 1966 and was honored with the prestigious Paul Harris Fellow Award in June of 1997. From 1945-1975 he was a Delegate for the Dairymen's League (Dairylea); he was past Secretary and member of Darcy Lodge F. & A.M.; was a longtime member of the Flemington Presbyterian Church, Flemington, NJ; was Treasurer of Raritan Township, NJ from 1961-1991; was a founding member of the Raritan Township Fire Company; served as Store Committeeman for Agway for thirty-five years; served on the Executive Committee of the Hunterdon County Board of Agriculture; was a longtime member of the Hunterdon County Republican Club; was an honorary member of the Future Farmers of America; served as Chairman of the Board of Directors of Somerset Savings and Loan from 1988-1992; served on the Raritan Township Board of Adjustment from 1991-1996; and was honored last year by being named to the Holcombe-Jimison Farmstead Farmers Honor Roll.

His cherished wife, Lillis Somerville Bowlby, died in 2001. He was also pre-deceased by his brother, Richard, in 2010, as well as a daughter-in-law, Susan, in 2008.



Clinton Sunrise Rotary - SUMMER HAS 'NEGATIVE' IMPACT ON OUR BLOOD SUPPLY: Rh negative Blood Types Are in Constant Demand. In response to an increased need for Rh negative blood, New Jersey Blood Services (NJBS) a division of the New York Blood Center (NYBC) is urging our community to roll up its sleeves, donate blood, and ensure hospital demands continue to be met over the summer. Each and every day there are patients who depend on the transfusion of red blood cells, platelets and plasma to stay alive. But blood and blood products can't be manufactured. They can only come from volunteer blood donors who take an hour to attend a blood drive or visit a donor center.

"Summer is crunch time for us," said NYBC Vice President Rob Purvis. "Potential donors go on vacation and the school term ends. We're asking people to schedule a blood donation along with their other summer plans."

Here are the Top Ten Facts About Our Community's Summer Blood Supply:

- 1. People with O-negative blood are known as "universal donors" because their blood can be transfused to anyone.
- 2. Type O-negative blood is found in just six percent of the population, and is often transfused to patients with other blood types in emergency rooms and trauma situations.
- 3. People with Rh negative blood, including A-, B- and O-, comprise just 15% of the population.
- 4. People of all blood types and ethnicities are encouraged to donate, and are critical to maintaining the diversity of our blood supply.
- 5. The months of June, July and August continue to present challenges as schools and colleges close for the summer and employees leave for summer vacations. More than 25% of blood donations collected each year come from our high school and college blood drives.
- 6. Every two seconds, someone needs blood.
- 7. According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), trauma accounts for 37 million emergency department visits and 2.6 million hospital admissions each year, nationwide.
- 8. Car accident and trauma victims may need 50 or more blood transfusions.
- 9. Police officers can be injured in the line of duty. First responders also face great danger during emergencies.
- 10. People can donate one pint of whole blood every 56 days and platelets every three days.

To help fill the gap in donations that occurs during the summer months, the Clinton Sunrise Rotary is sponsoring a Blood Drive on Saturday, July 28th from 8:30am-2:30pm at the Clinton Firehouse. Qualified donors should be at least 16 years of age (with parental consent), weigh a minimum of 110 pounds, and be in generally good health. Donors must present photo or signed ID. Donors over 75 years of age can also keep donating with their physician's note. To schedule an appointment call 1-800-933-BLOOD (2566) or visit www.nybloodcenter.org. Walk-ins are also welcome.

Last year's blood drive was a great success as generous community members heeded the call and donated a precious gift to help others – their blood. A good number of the donors were type O – a type that is often in short supply. "We want to at least match last year's donation level of units and, hopefully, exceed it," said Debra Shenberger, Clinton Sunrise Rotary's President. "We live in a caring community and can always count on the local residents to give of themselves to help others."

In addition to helping others, donors will receive something for themselves. Each donor will receive a pair of Mets Baseball tickets and have the opportunity to win a door prize: a 6 month family membership to the Hunterdon County YMCA along with a gym bag of goodies; or a digital camera from Sandrian Camera in Clinton.


